

College Admissions 2014

- Some statistics:
 - The number of HS graduates peaked in 2009 at 3.3 million. Numbers are projected to decline through 2014-2015, and remain below 2009 levels through at least 2020-21.
 - Although the number of graduates have declined, growth in the number of applications per student has continued to increase steadily.



Why/How are applications increasing?

• <u>TECHNOLOGY</u>

- Use of Internet and Social Media Tools in the recruitment process.
- Ease of applying



What does this mean?

- Average selectivity rate (% of students offered admission) is decreasing.
- This has created more difficulty for colleges to predict their "yield".
- The ease of applying to multiple colleges creates disincentives for students to spend time evaluating the "fit" of their college options.*

Why Do I Need to Think About This?

- Skills that count in the process learning starts now!
 - Interest and Goal development
 - Self–Advocacy
 - Focus on Writing Skills
- > Demonstrated Interest is playing a bigger role
- > Caution against "backward planning"
 - "My son will go to Harvard!"
- Let's talk about FIT

Timeline

•PSAT: Grade 10 for some, Grade 11 for all
•Visit, Visit, Visit - Grades 10 and 11
•SAT/ACT: Spring of Junior Year, plus Fall of Senior Year
•Visit, Visit, Visit - Grades 10 and 11
•Applications: BY Thanksgiving of Senior Year
•Results: Throughout Fall and Winter
•Financial Aid Decisions: Spring
•Decision (Deposit) must be made by 5/1
