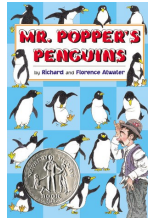
Alama Ada

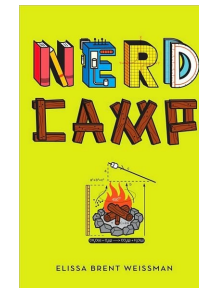

The Secret Ingredient

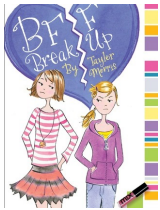

Mimi

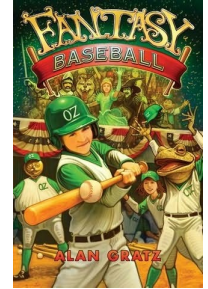
John Newman

Better Than Weird

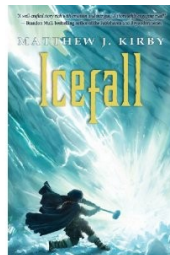
Anna Kerz
