### **Board Announcements**

Mrs. Pierno had the opportunity to attend the "Petting Zoo" hosted by MAPOB. She spoke of the wonderful opportunity it was for the third grade students to get a hands-on demonstration of the many different instruments. She thanked Mr. Golbert, MAPOB and all of the High School students who volunteered their time. Mrs. Pierno spoke of the POBOT's competition this weekend at Hofstra. She stated that the team won five matches and lost four; it was a successful event.

Ms. Gierasch stated that the competition was filmed and will be aired on "Late Night" with Seth Meyers at a later date.

Mrs. Schulman spoke of the three students who took home honorable mention at the Toshiba-ExploraVision event. Kudos to the students and the teachers.

Mrs. Lieberman expressed her pleasure in recognizing Crystal Kim for her accomplishment of being named North Shore Symphony Orchestra Young Artist. She will be playing with the North Shore Symphony Orchestra on June 13.

Mr. Bettan stated that last week they had the honor of honoring Ms. Miller, Mrs. Rothman and Ms. Gierasch at SCOPE's Annual School District Awards Dinner. Dr. Lewis was also honored last week. She was recognized as one of the top Superintendents at BOCES Education Partner Awards celebration.

Ms. Gierasch spoke of three POB seniors that were named semi-finalists in the American Museum of Natural History Young Naturalist competition. POB also had three students that participated in Research World at Molloy College.

### Board of Education Walk Through

Mr. Bettan stated that about five years ago they started doing building walkthroughs. Last year their main focus was on the building; this year the focus was on instruction.

Mrs. Rothman spoke of the visit to Mattlin MS. She talked about the 1:1 tablet initiative and how wonderful it was to see how excited the students are and how they work in partnerships. She spoke about the Amplified Program and how helpful it is. To date, there are no students who are off task. She spoke about the 8<sup>th</sup> grade Earth Science class studying maps and geography. She asked two students how using a tablet would change their learning; one student replied that it would be awesome.

Mrs. Schulman reported on the visit to the High School. She spoke about the AP Physiology and English classes they visited and the "Turn it in Program". In 11<sup>th</sup> grade English they discussed the "Dagger Speech". She witnessed lightening being made and a complete smorgasbord of other classes. She stated, that as a Board member, visiting the schools is one her favorite things to do.

Mrs. Lieberman reported on the visit to Parkway. She spoke about the research that was being done in conjunction with the STEAM initiative and this year's theme is light. She said that they visited a classroom where 4<sup>th</sup> graders were calibrating with a 2<sup>nd</sup> grade class. She said it was wonderful to see the 4<sup>th</sup> graders speaking with the 2<sup>nd</sup> graders as though they were peers. She said that the research projects are starting as early as 1<sup>st</sup> grade. Mrs. Lieberman said that learning with tablets has brought a new level of learning and excitement.

Mrs. Schulman reported on POBMS. She said that the school was embracing March Madness with book brackets. She spoke of the partnership with Ikea and the STEAM initiative and how hands on learning is incorporating math & art. The Board was able to see the space were the new music and Z-Space labs will be. She spoke of the life skills class and how they were cooking with literacy skills.

Mrs. Bernstein reported on Old Bethpage. She spoke of the visit to a 4<sup>th</sup> grade classroom and the terrariums they were working on. She said that the discussions they were having and the observations they were making were wonderful. In 3<sup>rd</sup> grade they were working on an engineering model. The students were so excited with their projects and much time and effort went into them. In 2<sup>nd</sup> grade they were working on "Learning by their Mistakes". In 1<sup>st</sup> grade the children were doing book reviews on books they have read. The faculty said that across the board hand writing has improved with the use of Fundations. She said that Ms. Gray Twitters the parents at least once a week and that the school is creating a Digital Mission Statement. She stated what a difference three years makes.

Mrs. Rothman reported on Stratford. She commented on the Friendship Bench Project. She spoke of the self-contained 3/4 class and their use of iPads for writing, math and reading. In another classroom two 4<sup>th</sup> grade classes were debating fairy tales, and another 4<sup>th</sup> grade class was debating Christopher Columbus.

Mr. Bettan reported on Pasadena, Mr. Greenberg's home school. He spoke about how amazing it was to see a 3<sup>rd</sup> grade class using 1:1 tablets for research. He said in another class they were working on a Trout Project (there were a lot of comments involving butter and lemon, although not in front of the kids). He saw dramatic changes in all of the elementary schools' writing from the last three years. He complimented Dr. Lewis and Ms. Gierasch for their leadership in implementing these changes.

Mr. Bettan reported on the K-Center. He spoke about the joy of seeing the children having fun learning. In math they were playing games with dice; one class won a pajama party with a literacy contest. He stated that great things are happening at POB.

Mr. Bettan thanked the staff for all of their hard work. He said that he knows that it was a little overwhelming at first, but now that we are at this point it's amazing to see what the kids can achieve. He thanked the elementary principals for all of their hard work regarding the plan to bring the kindergarten children back to their home schools.

### Discussion:

Mr. Greenberg stated that the feedback hasn't been great. He feels that it is worth looking into adding it to the 3<sup>rd</sup> or 4th grades as well.

Mrs. Bernstein agrees with Mr. Greenberg. She feels that they may need to tweak the program. She stated that in the 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> grades some of the parents are having trouble helping their children.

Mrs. Schulman would like more information on how it's being used.

Mrs. Rothman asked for more information and for Dr. Lewis' recommendation.

Mrs. Pierno hasn't heard much success with the program. She doesn't feel that they need to add another grade, but moving the program to 3<sup>rd</sup> grade may be more beneficial.

Mr. Bettan feels that AIS would be great to have before school.

Ms. Gierasch stated that they sent a survey out to the 2<sup>nd</sup> grade parents and she has received them back from two schools so far. She said that consistently there are about five children attending. She stated that some of the parents said that they did not know about the program, although it has been well publicized. She stated that she will tabulate the numbers and report back to the Board.

Mrs. Lieberman said that she would agree to move it from 2<sup>nd</sup> to 3<sup>rd</sup>.

Mr. Greenberg said we are really just budgeting to add another grade. They can leave it up to the professionals to decide which grade.

Mrs. Schulman would like to see a discussion on AIS being delivered in the morning.

The motion will be **Tabled** until the April 13th meeting.

Mr. Bettan started a discussion on the Capital Reserve Fund. He suggested that they raise it from four million to five million dollars. He mentioned that they should earmark it for updating the science and research labs in the high school.

Resolved unanimously upon motion by Mrs. Schulman, seconded by Mrs. Rothman that the Board of Education approve the following:

Increasing the Capital Reserve Fund to five million dollars.

Mr. Greenberg stated that this is not done automatically. It occurs in the event that there is money left at the end of the year that they will put back into the schools. It is up to five million dollars. By doing this there is no additional cost to the tax payers.

Mrs. Lieberman would like an update on the costs of the labs. She feels that this is the time to add to the budget if need be.

Ms. Gierasch stated that the estimate for the insulation for the music rooms is much higher than they thought.

Mr. Greenberg said that in regard to the proposed K-STEAM, 4R type morning program, maybe they can use part of the funds to help defray some of the cost.

Mrs. Lieberman stated that it is a self-sustaining program.

Dr. Lewis stated that it is not a budgeted item. However, if the Board wanted to give the program a boost with purchasing supplies, this would be the time.

# Public Participation

Ms. Stefanie Nelkens stated how disappointed she was in the condition of the novels for required reading at the High School level.

Mr. Rich D'Esposito expressed his concerns with the conflict regarding the Kindergarten orientation and the Board of Education meeting scheduled for May 27.

Dr. Lewis stated that she has looked into the concerns and there should not be a conflict. They will be honoring teachers receiving tenure and they will not start that part of the meeting until the K-Center parents get there.

Mr. David Kopp spoke about the closing of the K-Center and what impact it will have on the children. He stated that his three children went there and what a caring, nurturing and safe place it is.

Ms. Nina Melzer echoed Mr. D'Esposito's concerns.

Ms. Allison Halpern had a list of questions regarding closing the K-Center, including the savings for the district and the 10 year enrollment numbers.

Ms. Brianne Sulibhavi expressed her concerns over the scheduling of the K-orientation and the board meeting.

Mr. Jacques Wolfner ask for a full discussion on a few agenda items.

Mr. Rob Mascarelli stated his confusion about the mailings he has been receiving. He also asked for more information regarding the K-Center closing.

Dr. Lewis responded.

Mr. Bettan said that this has been an ongoing discussion. He asked if something could be built into the website for the community.

Dr. Lewis said that there will be two more meetings after the May 27<sup>th</sup> meeting, for the Board to vote. She would look into one of the snows days, possibly May 26<sup>th</sup> to hold a forum.

Mrs. Bernstein asked what would happen if they held off until the summer, to vote on the K-Center closing. She is not comfortable holding both meetings in the same night.

Dr. Lewis stated that in the motion it was said that this Board would vote on the closing.

Mrs. Lieberman stated that for the record she would like to see the date changed. She is not comfortable doing both in one night.
