There were approximately 25 district residents and staff members present.

Mr. Bettan called the meeting to order at 7:45 p.m.

The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

Mr. Bettan welcomed everyone to this evening's Board of Education meeting. He asked for a moment of silence in memory of the thirty soldiers who were shot down in Afghanistan.

Mr. Bettan stated that we have several important updates from the Superintendent. Our New York State Math and ELA scores have just been released to us. He noted that over the next year the community will be hearing the Board talk about APPR, Annual Professional Performance Review, for both teachers and administrators. This new reporting is mandated by the State and it is a work in progress that must be negotiated with our unions. Also the results are back from our school climate survey. Mr. Dempsey will give a quick overview this evening. He stated that Mr. Ruf will be giving us a presentation on using some of the excess funds in our child care program for some projects throughout the district that will benefit both the child care program and our district overall.

Mr. Bettan stated that we plan on having three workshop Board meetings this coming year. He noted that Academic Standards will be discussed on October 17, School Climate on December 5th and Financial Issues on January 23rd, 2012. He stated that all our stakeholders are invited to come down and listen as we get these reports, and as we discuss each subject. There will be no public participation after the workshop portion of each meeting. However, we value and want the community's feed back. We invite you to come to the following Board of Education meeting to share your thoughts with us. You can also send an e-mail to the Board via Harriet Fischer, the District Clerk.

Board Announcements

Mrs. Schulman stated that on Friday, August 5th, she, Mrs. Pierno, Mr. Cepeda, Mrs. Bernstein, Mr. Dempsey and Mr. Jonas went on a tour of the summer special education program. Mr. Lasher and Ms. Becker showed them around and they were able to watch a number of classes in session. They saw students working on art projects, learning about nature and learning academic skills. They also learned about other projects students worked on. They saw students of all ages from early elementary to high school students who were learning skills in the workplace. She expressed her views that they were very engaged and were very productive. It was also nice to see former students who were working as aides in the summer program. Some of them are going on to careers in special education. Mrs. Schulman noted that Dr. Farkas is having his last year with us. She expressed her views that he has been a resource and mentor for many students. She stated that the District appreciates his years of involvement in the program.

Mrs. Schulman also stated that on July 10, she and Mr. Cepeda were present at the dedication of the 9/11 Memorial on the corner of Old Country Road and Hope Drive. Supervisor Venditto, Assemblyman Lavine and Legislator Judy Jacobs were there representing local government. Boy scouts participated and there was an honor guard of police and fire forces. Kaitlin Sheehan, an alumna of our high school sang at the dedication. The memorial contains some wreckage from the disaster. Carol Meschkow and the Plainview-Old Bethpage Concerned Citizens were instrumental in obtaining this. It was a moving experience.

Mr. Cepeda noted that the piece of steel was from the World Trade Center. He too stated that this piece of steel was brought in by the Concerned Citizens in Plainview.

Superintendent's Announcements

New York State Grades 3-8 Assessment Results

Mr. Dempsey stated that the State Education Department released the results of grades 3-8 Assessment results in ELA and Math. The first several days the results were embargoed. The data was released this morning. He noted that we are getting the results later than last year. This has an impact on us because some may need AIS services. Mr. Dempsey stated that next year these assessments will be part of the end of year evaluation of teachers and principals. We don't know what the tests will be. We would like the tests earlier and the results earlier. Our initial review of the results will give some insights. Our students did better in math than in ELA. Our level 4 performance scores are not as good as last year. He noted that the nature of the test changed and the length of time of the tests were changed. He stated we are chasing a moving target.

Ms. Gierasch compared the ELA and math results from this year to last year. She reviewed the test design and she spoke of the length of the test. She stated that the State raised the proficiency standard scores to better reflect the level of achievement needed to indicate that a student is on track to achieve college ready scores on future state exams. The Department also made changes in this year's exams to make them more comprehensive and better measures of students' skills.

Mr. Bettan asked how 3rd graders sitting for a test two days in a row shows how prepared they are for college.

Ms. Gierasch stated there is a correlation.

Mr. Dempsey stated it is in the projection over the years.

Mrs. Rothman asked how we go about developing a strategy for developing student stamina.

Ms. Gierasch stated there are practice exercises that have to be built into the curriculum over the year.

Mrs. Rothman asked if we will be developing something that every teacher will be involved with.

Ms. Gierasch stated we do have plans for new curriculum and we are looking at our assessment tools. We are building this into staff development. We have a lot of plans underway. We have a lot of work.

Mrs. Lieberman asked if we are looking at how to deliver services. Are we giving the kids the services they really need. Are the kids that need extra help getting extra help. She wants to make sure we are providing the kids with the services they need to succeed.

Mrs. Lieberman expressed her views that the classroom teacher can spot the child in need. Their input is very important.

Ms. Gierasch stated we will be discussing this with the classroom teacher.

Ms. Gierasch explained how our tests were scored on line.

Mrs. Pierno clarified that we scored our own kids tests but we did it blindly.

Ms. Gierasch stated that students achieving level 4 dropped. She discussed the reasons for the drop.

Ms. Gierasch compared this year's math results to last year's results.

Mrs. Rothman asked with regard to ELA, can kids go out for AIS with children of like ability. She knows this is almost like grouping.

Mrs. Schulman asked if the results affect staffing.

Ms. Gierasch responded.

Mrs. Schulman asked if this will have an impact on scheduling.

Ms. Gierasch stated it could.

Mr. Dempsey stated the scheduling impact will not be as dramatic as last year.

Ms. Gierasch stated we don't know when we will have the parent report available.

Ms. Schulman asked if it will be available on line.

Mrs. Lieberman asked if we are going to be looking at delivering some kind of services to help the kids who scored in the low 3s to help them go up rather than down. Perhaps we could have our reading teachers help.

Mrs. Lieberman stated that she would like another discussion on this subject.

Annual Professional Performance Review Update

Mr. Dempsey stated there has been a change in the law that regulates and requires that students' ELA and Math results in grades 4 through 8 be part of the teachers and principal evaluation.

On August 30 and 31, teachers and principals will be going through state training. The plan will be on the website. It is a work in progress. He explained how the teachers' will be evaluated. He stated we will be talking about this periodically.

School Climate Survey Results

Mr. Dempsey discussed the climate survey building results. He discussed the results from students, from staff members and from parents. He discussed what the different groups were most positive and least positive about. In many cases the results are neutral or above. He noted that when you look at a composite score, it gives insight on what you have to work on. He discussed social, emotional safety and how people responded. The report will be shared with our stakeholders. He reviewed the responses from our schools. Mr. Dempsey stated that a district report will be presented in the fall.

Mr. Cepeda asked if there is a time line for negotiations for APPR.

Mr. Dempsey responded that you have to have a plan but there is no time line.

Mrs. Lieberman asked if the Board wants to look at the individual school's reports could they.

Mr. Dempsey stated that his instructions were that the Board should look at the District results first.

Mrs. Pierno stated that since we canvassed the entire parent population, how will the results be shared with the entire parent population. Will it be on our website. How are we going to share the results.

Mr. Dempsey stated that each building should do a presentation and we will do a district presentation.

Mr. Dempsey expressed his views that you need to celebrate positive results and work on what needs to be worked on.

Mrs. Schulman stated that it is good that we will do PTA presentations. However, she wants more parents to see the results.

Mrs. Schulman stated that when she took the survey there were times she wanted to give some feed back that was more explicit than a multiple choice answer.

Mr. Dempsey stated we will consider something like that.

Mr. Dempsey stated that our goal is to work on improving the climate.

Mrs. Bernstein asked if we anticipate the program that we might look at after we analyze the results district wide.

Mrs. Lieberman asked what grade we will start in.

Mr. Dempsey stated that the law says all grades.

Mrs. Schulman expressed her views that she was concerned that the feedback from parents was constrained by multiple choice questions.

Mr. Cepeda stated it was a good step forward.

Mr. Dempsey stated in the early fall we will be getting more detailed results.

Mrs. Bernstein asked if we anticipate that each building will discuss the results at a PTA meeting.

Mr. Dempsey stated that was his original thought. But perhaps a more open meeting would be better. The results should be discussed at the building level.

Report

Child Care Fund Project

Mr. Ruf stated that the District runs an extremely efficient child care program. Over time, \$400,000 had accumulated in the District's Child Care Fund. The district uses \$75,000 annually as revenue from the child care fund to offset the tax levy. He noted that in addition to providing revenue to the general fund, the child care fund may be utilized as a funding source for projects related to the program.

Ms. Parahus stated that she, Mr. Ruf and the building principals have identified several projects for the district to consider funding through the child care program. She reviewed the possible projects at the K-Center, the elementary schools and the middle schools. Ms. Parahus stated that our district's insurance carrier has made a series of recommendations for the removal of several pieces of playground equipment that is beyond its useful life. She noted that Pasadena's equipment and furniture was replaced when it was reopened ten years ago and as a result does not need to be replaced at this time.

Mr. Ruf stated that we make every effort possible to provide an equal amount of funds for each building. No new projects were recommended for the high school due to the fact that they do not have a child care program at that school. Mr. Ruf stated we are trying to increase the amount of air conditioners in our schools.

Mr. Jonas noted that our child care rates have remained the same for the past three years.

Mr. Cepeda expressed his views that we have a very effective and efficient child care program in our district. These recommended projects are good things to spend the funds on. He asked if the projects mentioned would cost the entire \$400,000.

Mr. Ruf stated it would not.

Mrs. Bernstein stated that it appears to be a good plan. She expressed her views that in these difficult economic times perhaps we should consider lowering the cost of the child care program. These are all our parents.

Mr. Ruf would not recommend a change in the child care fees in the 2011/2012 school year but would look at it after this year.

Mrs. Lieberman agrees with Mrs. Bernstein. It would be nice if we could give something back to our parents.

Mrs. Pierno thanked Ms. Parahus for her hard work. She asked if we are going to try to keep equity in all schools.

Mr. Ruf stated that we will try. He noted that when the numbers are finalized, we will get back to the Board.

Mr. Dempsey discussed the donation of 1.5 million dollars by Mayor Bloomberg and five of his friends that allowed some of the January regent's exams to continue.

Public Participation

Mrs. Stefanie Nelkins agrees with Mr. Bettan and Mrs. Schulman that the scope of the responses on the climate survey were shaped by the questions asked. In terms of the ELA and Math assessments, she asked when the parents will find out the results.

Ms. Gierasch stated a letter will go out in the middle of September from BOCES.

Mrs. Nelkins discussed the breaking down of the ELA scores. There are writing issues. She asked if the district is going to look more into children expressing themselves with words.

Ms. Gierasch stated there are writing groups in the schools. Eligibility is determined by the student's results at the building level.

Mrs. Chris D'Alessandro asked if we will be letting students take the English Regents exam in January. She hopes that we will be proactive and have the English exam offered in January to both our special education students and our A.P. students.

Mr. Dempsey expressed his views that there is pressure to have the State continue the regent's exams in January.

Mrs. Schulman asked if we know how the kids did in the January regents.

Mr. Jacques Wolfner expressed his views that the school district is going to have a real challenge on how to manage the 2% tax cap. He asked for a detailed explanation of several items under "Finance". He also asked for a detailed explanation of "Refunding of 2002 School Bonds/Library Bonds" under "New Business".
