Lauren DiPierri - Soccer

Lauren was a dedicated member of the Varsity Girls' Soccer team for five years. Her exemplary skills and commitment garnered her numerous accolades, including 4th Team All-State honors in 2023 and All-County Honors in 2022.

During her senior year, Lauren played a pivotal role in leading the Hawks to an impressive 11-3-2 record, securing their third consecutive Nassau County Semi-final playoff berth.

Lauren's remarkable achievements extend beyond the field as she solidified her legacy in the POB history books. She concluded her high school career as the second all-time leader in goals (28) and points (40).

Lauren is set to embark on the next chapter of her journey at Cornell University, where she will continue her academic and athletic career.



Michael D'Ambrosio - Baseball

Throughout his baseball career, Michael distinguished himself with exceptional achievements. He earned All-County honors twice, in 2023 and 2024. His outstanding abilities were further acknowledged when he was named to Newsday's All Long Island 1st team in 2023 and 2024. As a senior, Michael's exemplary performance led to his well-deserved recognition as the Conference Player of the Year and winning the Joe Correa Diamond Award for the Top All-Around Baseball player in Nassau County.

During his senior year, Michael demonstrated remarkable skill, boasting a batting average of .471, along with 10 home runs and 39 RBIs. Furthermore, he showcased his versatility by achieving 7 wins on the mound with an ERA of .627, setting a school record in the process. Michael's contributions were instrumental in guiding the Hawks to their third consecutive conference championship.

Michael's legacy extends beyond his senior year, as he established numerous school records throughout his career. He holds the career record in hits (100), RBIs (92), home runs (17), doubles (20), career batting average (.435), slugging percentage (.770), on-base percentage (.526), and OPS (1.295). Additionally, he holds the record for the highest single-season totals in home runs (10), RBIs (39) and ERA (.627).

Michael is poised to continue his academic and baseball pursuits at Hofstra University next year.

Emma Lipner - Soccer, Basketball and Lacrosse

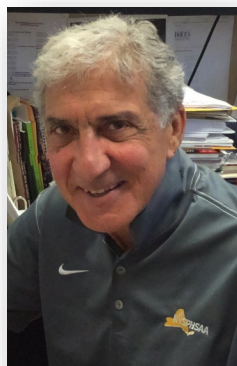
Emma was a 3 sport athlete, she was a member of the soccer, basketball and lacrosse teams.

James hails from Farragut, Idaho, and completed his secondary education at Massapequa High School in 1961. During his time there, he participated on both the soccer and basketball teams. Following graduation, he continued his studies at Cortland State Teachers College, earning his degree in 1965.

Upon his graduation, James began his professional journey in the physical education department at Plainview-Old Bethpage Junior High School.

Within the Plainview district, James took on coaching responsibilities for junior high school boys' basketball, eventually becoming the head basketball coach at Plainview High School in 1970. He held this position until 1976, achieving notable successes, including 33 wins and two playoff appearances. Additionally, in 1967, James started the boys' lacrosse program at John F. Kennedy High School, where he led the team to two league championships (1970, 1971) and coached four All-Americans. He was recognized with the Alan Lowe Award in 1970, acknowledging him as the Coach of the Year in Nassau County.

In 1977, James transitioned to Johns Hopkins University, where he served as the head men's basketball coach and assistant men's lacrosse coach. His tenure culminated in three NCAA Lacrosse National Championships (1978, 1979, and 1980).

Returning to Long Island in 1982 as a physical education teacher at Division High School, James took on the role of head coach for the boys' soccer, basketball, and lacrosse teams. Under his leadership, Division High School secured two lacrosse League Championships.

In 1991, James became Chairperson, later transitioning to Director of Physical Education and Athletics at Bethpage High School. Throughout his tenure, he continued to coach varsity soccer, basketball, and lacrosse, leading the lacrosse team to victory in the NYSPHSAA 1996 Class B State Championship.

In 1999, James moved to Cold Spring Harbor to assume the position of Director of Physical Education and Athletics until his retirement in 2013. He returned to serve as the Director of Athletics and Physical Education at Manhasset High School from 2013 to 2021.

James's contributions extend beyond coaching, including significant roles in athletics administration. He has served as the NYSPHSAA Boys Lacrosse State Coordinator since 2011 and held various leadership roles within Section VIII Athletics. He has been recognized with accolades such as the Athletic Director of the Year by NYSAHPERD and inductions into prestigious institutions including the Long Island Metropolitan Lacrosse Hall of Fame, Massapequa High School Hall of Fame, Bethpage Wall of Fame, National Interscholastic Coaches Hall of Fame, and the Nassau County Athletics Hall of Fame.

James currently resides in Northport with his wife of 48 years, Tricia. Together, they are proud parents to three children - Scott, Lauren, and Brian - and doting grandparents to seven cherished grandchildren.

Robert was born in St. Albans Naval Hospital in 1954 and his family relocated to Plainview in 1965. In 1972 Robert graduated from Plainview-Old Bethpage High School.

A standout athlete, Robert excelled in football, lacrosse, and basketball, earning three-year varsity letters in football and lacrosse, and two-year varsity letters in basketball. He played a pivotal role in securing the Gulls' 1971 North Shore III League Football Championship. As a senior, he garnered recognition as an All-County and All-Long Island Running Back, narrowly missing the prestigious Thorpe Award, an honor bestowed upon Nassau County's top football player.

In lacrosse, Robert's senior year saw him lead the Gulls' to a North Shore III League Lacrosse Championship. His prowess as a midfielder earned him All-American honors, amassing an impressive 103 points with 64 goals and 39 assists, including a record-setting 15 points in a single game against Great Neck South. Additionally, he earned All-Division honors in basketball during his senior year.

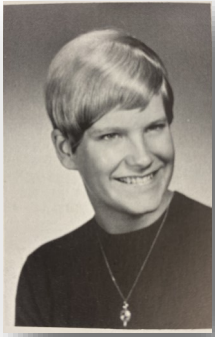
Continuing his academic and athletic journey, Robert pursued his education at the US Naval Academy, where he continued to shine in lacrosse. His freshman year saw him tally 18 goals and 8 assists, and during his sophomore year he led the Midshipmen to their first-ever NCAA National Championship game appearance, leading the team in goals with 37. Transferring to Johns Hopkins University, Robert continued his lacrosse dominance, guiding the Blue Jays to consecutive NCAA Championship game appearances in 1977 and 1978, ultimately clinching the NCAA Men's Lacrosse Championship in 1978. Throughout his collegiate career, Robert earned All-America honors each year.

Post-graduation from Johns Hopkins in 1978 with a Bachelor's Degree, Robert ventured into the corporate world, assuming the role of managing partner at a consulting firm specializing in corporate governance services.

Robert was inducted into the Long Island - Metropolitan Lacrosse Foundation Hall of Fame in 2001 and the Nassau County Hall of Fame in 2023.

Robert was married to Maryann for 26 years. They were the adoptive parents of three children - (Katia, Darya and Irina). All three children currently serve as military officers (2 - Marine Corps, 1 - Naval Aviator).

Betsy “Dier” Woodcock moved to the Plainview school district in 1964 at the age of 14. Her parents chose Plainview Schools for their strong swimming program. She was a member of the first graduating class from John F. Kennedy High School in 1968 and served as Senior Class President. Betsy was a strong contributing four-year member of the swim team, serving as the team captain during her junior and senior years. Her ability to compete in any swim event made her an invaluable asset. Pre-Title IX she also participated in basketball, softball, volleyball, and gymnastics and the Leaders Club. She earned numerous honors during her high school years, including Most Outstanding Swimmer, Most Outstanding Athlete (Lady Victory), and the Physical Education Graduation Medal.

Following high school, Betsy attended the State University College at Cortland, where she continued her swimming career as a member of the Varsity Women's Swim Team. She was named the Most Outstanding Swimmer and was part of the 1971 SUNY State Champion Medley Relay team. Betsy graduated from Cortland with a Bachelor of Education (1972), a Master of Education (1975), and completed a Certificate of Advanced Study in Education (1982).

Betsy spent her professional career as a Physical Education teacher at Liverpool Central Schools, where she taught physical education and coached for over 30 years. She coached varsity teams in swimming, gymnastics, cheerleading and a host of JV and modified teams, including soccer, basketball, and track and field.

Betsy has been married for 52 years to her husband, Craig. After college she lived in Liverpool, New York and worked for the Liverpool Central School District before retiring to Leesburg, Florida in 2005 and her summer home in Loring, Ontario. She is the proud mother of three children: son Matt, who graduated from the United States Military Academy at West Point and played soccer; son Brett, who graduated from LeMoyne College in Syracuse and played baseball; and daughter Morgan, who graduated from Boston College and played volleyball. Joan's journey began at Long Beach High School, where she graduated in 1958. She proceeded to earn a Bachelor's Degree in Physical Education and Health Recreation from NYU in January 1964.

Following her graduation from NYU, Joan embarked on a distinguished 36 ½ -year teaching career in the Plainview-Old Bethpage Central School District. Over the years, she contributed significantly to several schools within the district. From 1964 to 1978, she taught at Joyce Road School, Parkway Elementary School, and Old Bethpage Elementary School. Subsequently, she served at Mattlin Middle School from 1978 to 1982. Joan concluded her tenure with the district, spending her final 18 years at Parkway Elementary School. During her career, she initiated and directed a Physical Education Honor Program for elementary school students, focusing on gymnastics and various team sports.

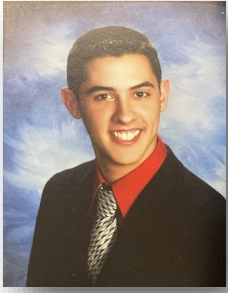
Joan was a trailblazer for girls' sports in the Plainview-Old Bethpage District. She launched the softball program at Kennedy High School in 1966-1967 and established the school's first girls' basketball team in 1973-1974, a position she held until 1985-1986.

Additionally, Joan played a pivotal role in the development of the JFK Girls' Volleyball team, assuming the varsity head coaching role just two weeks into its inaugural season (1974-1975). Under her guidance, Kennedy High School clinched two Division Championships (1978-1979, 1985-1986).

Joan's dedication and impact were recognized through various accolades, including the Elementary PE Teacher of the Year for Nassau County in March 1988 and the POB Title IX Award in 2002. In 1992, she received a commendation from the Town of Oyster Bay for her outstanding achievements.

Currently residing in Lido Beach, NY, Joan is a proud mother of one daughter, Jenny.

Matthew was born and raised in Plainview, NY. He was a 4 year member of the bowling team.

Throughout his high school bowling career, Matthew was named to the All-State team three times (2009, 2010, and 2012) and to the All-County team once (2011). In 2012, he earned Dexter/USBC High School All-American honors. During his senior year, Matthew set the Long Island High School Bowling Record with a scoring average of 244.4, a record that still stands today. He also won the Nassau County Individual Bowling Championship and was the New York State Runner-up. Twice he was named to the first team of the Newsday's All-Long Island Bowling Team. In 2012 he was honored as the Long Island Bowler of the Year by Newsday.

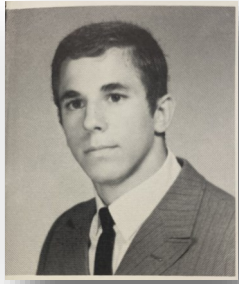
After high school, Matthew represented the United States as a member of Junior Team USA from 2013 to 2015. In 2013, he secured three gold medals and one silver medal at the Pan-American Championships. He went on to win the World Championship in 2014. In 2018, he represented the USA again in the Pan American Games, where Team USA won the Pan American Championship. In total, he earned five gold medals, three silver medals, and one bronze medal for Team USA.

From 2016 to 2018, Matthew served as a graduate assistant coach for the women's bowling team at McKendree University. He contributed to the Bearcats' success, leading them to two National Championship matches (2017 and 2018), and winning the NCAA National Championship in 2017 with a 4-0 victory over Nebraska.

Matthew graduated from Stony Brook University in 2016 with a Bachelor's degree in Business Administration. He later earned a Master's degree in Business Administration from McKendree University.

Currently, Matthew works for KR Strikeforce, one of the world's largest bowling equipment manufacturers. He is engaged to Ana Sofia Olaya Ramos, and they have a black lab named Bocker.

Ralph was born in South Bend, Indiana, and relocated to Plainview in 1963. He is the son of Coy McGee, tailback and kick returner on the great Notre Dame teams of the 1940s, and nephew of Green Bay Packer great, Max McGee.

Ralph excelled as a two-sport athlete at JFK, showcasing his talents in football and lacrosse, while also engaging in track and wrestling during his freshman year.

His prowess on the football field earned him the distinction of a three-year varsity player, with notable achievements including All-County honors in both his junior and senior years. As a senior, he was bestowed with the Team MVP title and was selected for the prestigious Gridiron 44. Notably, during his junior year, Ralph contributed significantly to Kennedy High School's success, clinching a North Shore III Conference Championship with a 6-2 record.

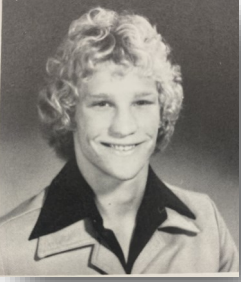
Additionally, Ralph demonstrated his prowess in lacrosse as a three-year member of the varsity team. His tenure coincided with Kennedy High School's impressive 32-17 record, marked by two conference championships in 1970 and 1971. His exceptional performance during his senior year merited inclusion in the High School All-American Team.

Post high school, Ralph pursued his academic and athletic ambitions at the University of Pennsylvania, where he competed in football and lacrosse for the Quakers. His football career spanned 19 games, during which he amassed 424 rushing yards, averaging 6.1 yards per carry. In lacrosse, Ralph contributed to his team's success during the 1974 and 1975 seasons, culminating in runner-up finishes in the Ivy League and a berth in the NCAA playoffs in 1975. In 1974, he tied for most goals scored.

Ralph graduated from the Wharton School of Business at the University of Pennsylvania with a Bachelor's Degree in Economics. He has been a computer programmer for the majority of his career.

Ralph has been married to his wife, Terri, for 42 years. Together, they proudly raised their three children, Alicia, Adam, and Matthew, and delight in their roles of grandparents to their six grandchildren.

Ken was born and raised in Plainview. He played soccer, wrestling and baseball each year at Mattlin Junior High.

At Kennedy, Ken was a three-year starter on both the varsity soccer and wrestling teams. He was co-captain of each team during his senior year.

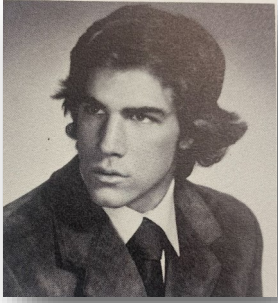
Ken was the center midfielder on the 1977 boys' soccer team that traveled to Holland in the summer and returned to win the North Shore Division II Championship that fall, boasting a 17-1-1 record. During his career, the boys' soccer team had an overall record of 37-12-3, with Ken earning All-Division honors during his junior season and All-North Shore honors during his senior year.

Wrestling at 112 and 119 pounds, Ken's dual match record over three years at Kennedy was a remarkable 31-2. During those years, Ken won five individual tournament championships, and the wrestling team secured three Division Championships and two Conference Championships. Ken received All Division and All North Shore honors during each of his three seasons of high school wrestling.

Following his graduation from Kennedy High School, Ken attended Princeton University, where he graduated Summa Cum Laude in 1982. After earning his MD in 1986, he completed his Medicine Residency and Cardiology Fellowship at the Mayo Clinic from 1986 to 1993.

Currently, Ken is a Physician-Scientist at the University of Pennsylvania's School of Medicine, specializing in Heart Failure and Transplantation. He has been happily married to Dr. Susan Sheps-Margulies for 40 years (as of next week). They are proud parents of Emily and Rachel, and doting grandparents of Izzy.

Scott Ullger was born and raised in Plainview, NY. Throughout his formative years at Kennedy High School, he showcased remarkable prowess as a two-sport athlete, excelling in both football and baseball.

Earning distinction as a three-year member of the varsity football and baseball teams, Scott's leadership qualities shone brightly during his senior year when he was bestowed with the honor of team captain.

Following his high school tenure, Scott pursued collegiate baseball at St. John's University, where he contributed significantly to the team's success, propelling them to the NCAA Tournament on three occasions.

In 1977, Scott's exceptional talent garnered recognition when he was drafted in the 18th round by the Minnesota Twins in the Major League Baseball draft. Over the course of 10 minor league seasons spanning from Class A to Class AAA baseball, he showcased his formidable skills, boasting a batting average of .279, along with 132 home runs and 602 RBIs. On April 17, 1983, he marked his professional debut for the Minnesota Twins, showcasing his prowess at first base over 28 games.

Transitioning seamlessly from player to coach, in 1988, he assumed the managerial reins of Visalia Oaks, a role in which he excelled, culminating in the prestigious accolade of California League Manager of the Year in 1990, with his team achieving a 90-51 record. His coaching acumen further flourished during his tenure with Class AAA Portland Beavers/Salt Lake Buzz.

Scott's illustrious coaching career extended to the professional ranks, notably with the Minnesota Twins from 1995 to 2014. His multifaceted contributions encompassed diverse roles within the coaching staff, serving as the third-base coach from 1995 to 1998 and 2006 to 2010, the hitting coach from 1999 to 2005, the bench coach from 2011 to 2012, and finally, as the first-base coach from 2013 to 2014. During his time with the Twins the team won six AL Central Championships.

Scott currently lives in Visalia, CA with his wife.

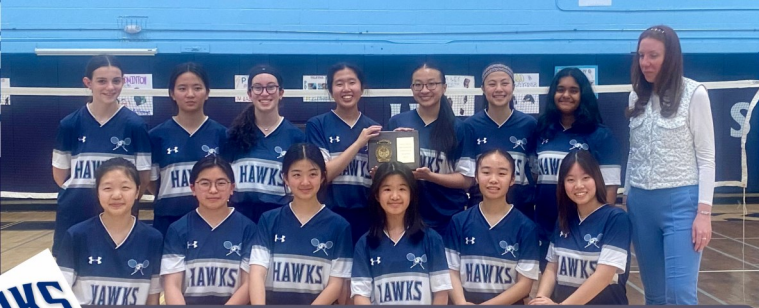
