<u>Overview</u>



- On March 27, 2020, Congress passed, and the President signed into law, the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act. The CARES Act provides \$30.75 billion nationwide in the Education Stabilization Fund to prevent, prepare for and respond to the Coronavirus;
- On December 27, 2020, the President signed into law the Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act, 2021 (CRRSA Act). The CRRSA Act provides \$81.88 billion nationwide in a second Education Stabilization Fund to prevent, prepare for and respond to the coronavirus; and
- On March 11, 2021, the President signed into law the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 (ARP). ARP makes available \$122.8 billion nationally in a third round of Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief (ARP-ESSER) funds, of which the USDE must use \$800 million to provide homeless children and youth with wrap-around services and assistance to attend school and participate fully in school activities.

Period of Funds Availability

Since these funds have a finite timespan and are not recurring State Aid, the Federal Government and NYSED advises that all funds should be used for "one-time" programs and expenditures with the expectation that their need and funding source will come to an end soon.

Allowable Uses of Funds

CARES Act

The CARES Act includes funds related to preventing, preparing for and responding to COVID-19.

There are no "set-aside" requirements for these funds.

Coronavarus

These funds may be used for the same allowable purposes as CARES Act and ARP, including hiring new staff and avoiding layoffs.

The "additional" allowable uses of funds under the CRRSA Act (addressing learning loss, preparing schools for reopening, and testing, repairing, and upgrading projects to improve air quality in school buildings) already are permitted under the CARES Act.

There are no "set-aside" requirements for these funds.

<u>Set-aside</u>: a portion of funds that must be used for a specific purpose that is explicitly identified in the requirements of a grant.

Allowable Uses of Funds

ARP

Districts must <u>set aside</u> at least 20 percent of their total ARP allocation to address learning loss through the implementation of evidence-based interventions, and ensure that such interventions respond to students' academic, social, and emotional needs and address the disproportionate impact of COVID-19 on underrepresented student subgroups.

The remaining ARP funds may be used for the same allowable purposes as CARES and CRRSA, including hiring new staff and avoiding layoffs.

The legislation specifically authorizes districts to use ARP funds to develop strategies and implement public health protocols including, to the greatest extent practicable, policies in line with guidance from the CDC for the reopening and operation of school facilities to effectively maintain the health and safety of students, educators, and other staff. Schools may also use their CARES and CRRSA funds for this purpose, although it is not expressly listed in the CARES or CRRSA Act.

Timeline

ARP and CRSSA Planning and Oversight

May 10 – Informational presentation to the Board of Education (BoE)

May 11 – Call for Steering Committee Members (PTA, Central Office, PCT and ASDA)

Steering Committee Meeting Dates – May 18th, May 24th and June 1st

June 7 – Report to BoE

By June 15th – Develop and submit grants in consultation with stakeholders

Completed applications are due to SED by June 15th and will be reviewed on a rolling basis.
