Planned Initiatives 2023-2024

ENGLISH/SOCIAL STUDIES:

Literacy Lab to be taught by English and Social Studies teachers to replace older model of separate support services with a goal of avoiding "over-servicing" and creating more options for students to pursue electives (or lunch)

BUSINESS:

Complete re-do of the Virtual Enterprise classroom to create a 21st century workspace.

TWILIGHT SCHOOL:

Continue to develop a pathway for new ENL students to allow for faster acclimation to the High School. Students will learn the critical life skills to become a successful High School student. Examples include crafting emails to teachers, organization development, homework, and advocating. Students will also experience opportunities to work in co-taught ENL/English classrooms to increase their understanding of the English language more quickly.

MATHEMATICS:

Re-imagining High School Math Lab (Algebra) to better serve students' and teachers' needs.
