Student Services & Safety Goals



Strategic Plan Priority Area 4: Connections and Collaboration

Objective: We will provide each member of the school community a voice to share their views, aspirations, and expertise to foster an environment that honors connections and collaboration among all stakeholders.

- ✓ Implement recommendations from the District Welcoming Committee to help improve the overall onboarding experience of new entrants and their families
 - Streamline the registration process by utilizing online registration and reflecting current guidelines from NYSED
 - Translate the registration application into alternate languages (Chinese, Korean & Spanish)
 - Provide in-person support to families in need of inclusive translation services
 - Develop a "Welcome to POB!" correspondence inclusive of important District and building-based resources

Strategic Plan Priority Area 5: Finance and Facilities

Objective: We will provide sound, responsible financial stewardship through the management and maintenance of efficient financial practices.

- ✓ Continue to support a safe environment that best supports learning across all grade-levels and schools
- ✓ Develop a transportation schedule focused on maximizing the use of District and vendor contracted vehicles while maintaining the highest level of service to the community
- ✓ Work collaboratively with the Athletics Office to maximize the use of District transportation to support athletic shuttles
- ✓ Conduct a review of staffing assignments to ensure the placement of security guards and bus attendants are maximized
- ✓ Utilize in-house technology staffing to develop a system to manage student arrival and off-campus privileges at JFK HS

Transportation Points of Pride

5,482 Students Routed To and From 54 Schools

- ✓ 5,240 students transported to the 7 in-District schools
- ✓ 205 students transported to 28 private & parochial schools (+2)
- √ 37 students transported to 19 special education placements (-1)
- ✓ Support transportation to mid-day and after-school programs such as:

 Work Study, Project Challenge, Discovery Lab, Fun Time, Twilight Program, TAG and various athletic shuttles
- ✓ Coordinate field trip transportation for all in-District schools

- ✓ Expanded communication regarding substitute bus drivers to include texts and emails





- ✓ Reviewed District boundary lines and identified split properties shared with other districts
- ✓ Support of the District's Welcoming Committee and subsequent recommendations

Safety & Security Updates for the 2022-2023 School Year

- ✓ Reallocation of security staff throughout the District, including Jamaica Avenue
- ✓ Additional focus on physical and virtual patrols of the interior and exterior of schools
- ✓ Implementation of One Point of Entry Procedures for staff
- ✓ Replacement of obsolete cameras throughout the District
- ✓ Installation of additional cameras in the elementary schools
- ✓ Support of revised elopement procedures throughout the District

Transportation

- ✓ Perform a comprehensive review of existing routes to ensure posted times on the Parent Portal are as accurate as possible
- ✓ Upgrade existing routing software with training for office staff
- ✓ Routing with a continued focus on efficiency and fiscal responsibility
- ✓ Participate in the planning and implementation of the Stop Arm Camera project at POB

Student Registration

- ✓ Streamline student registration procedures to reflect current NYSED guidance
- ✓ Translate the registration application into alternate languages (Chinese, Korean & Spanish)
- ✓ Implement in-person meetings with translation and technology services for new families requiring this support
- ✓ Implement a "Welcome to POB!" communication inclusive of District's "Points of Pride" for new entrants and families

Student Services & Safety Initiatives for 2023-2024

Safety & Security

- ✓ Coordination with the Nassau County Police Department, Homeland Security and the Plainview Fire Department to evaluate current practices and implement recommendations
- ✓ Dedicated emergency access control for the Nassau County Police Department
- ✓ Implementation of an elementary door ajar system with automated notifications
- ✓ Continue to expand the District's hand-held radio system (repeater installation)
- ✓ Continued replacement of obsolete security cameras
- ✓ Strategic placement of additional cameras at the middle schools and high school
- ✓ Refined arrival procedures for high school students
