MATH 7-For students who did not pass Math 7. There will be a final in this course.

MATH 8—For students who did not pass Math 8. There will be a final in this course.

ALGEBRA I — For students who failed Algebra I or extended Algebra I course.

MATH ANALYSIS / ALGEBRAIC PRINCIPLES — For students WHO HAVE ALREADY PASSED THE Common Core Algebra I Regents. This course will not lead to an advanced Regents diploma however, it will fulfill a third Math credit.

GEOMETRY — For students who failed the Geometry or Extended Geometry course.

ALGEBRA II — For students who failed Algebra II or extended Algebra II course.

Only the second half of full-year courses are offered in the Summer School. Eligibility requirements for admittance to a single session (115 minutes) course presume a successful completion of the first half-year study in the regular school year.

The English 7-8 and Social Studies 7-8 programs are skills oriented with an emphasis on developmental writing skills.

Students taking Earth Science, Living Environment and/or Chemistry must present the home-principal's statement that full laboratory requirements have been met.

PURPOSE: Our aim is to provide students with credit recovery. No special program, however well planned, can be fully successful without the understanding and cooperation of teacher, parent and students. In the past, those who have made the best progress in Summer School are those who have had regular attendance and been motivated by a real desire to improve.

ELIGIBILITY: Students who are in grades seven or above in the 2023 Spring term in any public, private or parochial secondary school and are residents of either Bethpage or Plainview-Old Bethpage School Districts are eligible to register for summer courses with the written approval of their home school principal. Eligibility requirements for students attending the Summer School program are as follows:

- (1) A student who fails a course but passes the Regents may attend Summer School for credit.
- (2) A student who fails a course and the Regents may attend Summer School provided—[a] The student did not receive a final grade of less than 50 and, [b] The student's classroom attendance is in compliance with the district's policy.
- (3) A student who has passed a course as well as the Regents exam may not attend summer school in an effort to improve his or her grade.

STUDENT ATTITUDE AND CONDUCT: Immediate and thorough application to the work to be accomplished is expected of all students. Consequently, any student whose conduct is not satisfactory, or who is not seriously applying himself/herself to the task, may be dropped from the Summer School Program. All Bethpage Public Schools' rules and regulations governing the conduct of students during the regular school year are applicable to Summer School. Smoking, vaping, use of alcohol or drugs in the school or on the grounds is illegal by New York State Law and will result in dismissal from Summer School.

SUBJECT CREDIT: A single-period summer course is considered the equivalent of one semesters work in a subject during the regular school year. In any instance where a student successfully completes a summer school course, the summer school grade will be indicated on the permanent record and both the summer school grade and the previous grade in the course will be averaged to determine class rank.

STUDENTS LIMITED TO TWO SUBJECTS:

Students should take no more than two subjects in summer school.

MINIMUM CLASS REGISTRATION:

A minimum registration of fifteen students is required for the establishment of a Summer School class. For classes that are needed by seniors for graduation or where the special needs of students warrant, a class with a minimum registration of ten students may be created. Nassau BOCES reserves the right to cancel classes due to insufficient class size / enrollment.

ATTANDENCE POLICY:

Regular attendance in school is a major factor in academic success. This is especially true in the summer school program in only 22 class sessions. Therefore, any student with more than three (3) absences, regardless of their nature, in a class will not receive credit in that class. Additionally, each lateness over fifteen minutes will be considered a half of an unexcused absence. Lateness under fifteen minutes is considered a quarter of an absence.

SCHEDULE:

Summer School will begin Monday, July 10, 2023 and classes will end on Tuesday, August 15th. Local final examinations will be administered on Monday, August 15th. Summer School is held Monday through Thursday. NY State Regents exams are administered August 16th and 17th.

* NO FINAL EXAMINATIONS WILL BE GIVEN BEFORE TUESDAY, AUGUST 15TH • NO EXCEPTIONS!

REPORTS TO PARENTS/GUARDIAN AND HOME SCHOOL PRINCIPALS: Mid-term reports will be mailed to the parent/guardian after three weeks of instruction. At the end of the summer session, grades will be mailed to the parent/guardian and to the home-school principal.

TEXTBOOKS: Students will be supplied with district-owned textbooks, but in some courses they will be expected to purchase other books and supplies at modest cost. Students will be charged for lost or damaged books.

USE OF PARKING FACILITIES: Student parking will be available in the designated areas at the school. Bicycles should be chained to the designated racks provided for students. Bicycles are not to be chained to trees or sign posts.

Period 2: 10:00am—11:55am

AUDITING: No student may audit a Summer School class.

REGISTRATION:

- 1. Obtain a registration form from your school counselor.
- 2. The Registration form must be signed by your school counselor and/or principal.
- 3. **Bethpage/POB School Districts Residents** who are not enrolled in the public schools of the District must bring written proof of residence when they register. Current utility bills are acceptable.
