The meeting was called to order at 8:25 p.m.

High School Update

Amanda Bressner, our high school representative, updated the Board of Education of events that occurred and events that will happen at the high school.

Board Announcements

Mrs. Rothman stated that she had an opportunity to view the beautiful art exhibit at Mattlin MS and the elementary exhibit at POBMS. She commented that growth and maturity were very apparent in their work. She congratulated the students for all their hard work and she also congratulated their teachers who mentored them.

Mrs. Bernstein had the pleasure of attending the Underclassmen Awards Assembly at the High School. She stated that the sense of pride on the faces of the students, staff and parents was wonderful to see. She noted how meaningful these awards ceremonies are. She was particularly proud of a student with special needs who worked very hard for his award, and equally proud of the long and loud round of applause he received from the students and parent community. Congratulations to the students, parents, staff and to the High School administration for such a wonderful ceremony.

Mr. Bettan also attended the Science Symposium. He spoke of all the wonderful events occurring within the High School, including Moot Court, DECA, and Odyssey of the Mind. He feels that the more opportunities the students have with clubs in high school, the more they will have a"leg up" when they get to college. He hopes that more students will participate in these programs.

Superintendent's Announcements

Dr. Lewis also discussed the Odyssey of the Mind team and how they came in 10th place out of 67 national placed teams, holding their own against the team from Singapore. She stated that she was speaking with a parent whose children are involved in DECA, and how it had prepared his son who is out in the business world and all that DECA has done for their family. Dr. Lewis also had an opportunity to see the Mattlin Art Exhibit and spoke of how wonderful it was.

Dr. Lewis commented on all of the fund raising efforts occurring in our district, including "Relay for Life" and stated what a generous and caring school community we have.

Dr. Lewis spoke of a new phenomenon that Mr. Murray brought to her attention called "yick-yack".

Dr. Eagen stated that daily there are new instruments for "social evilness", yick-yack being the newest. He said that they working with the High School and the Technology Department to pin point the signal around the schools and are blocking it. He said that Laurie Lynn has been wonderful in heading up a group that is focusing on "digital citizenship".

Ms. Gierasch said that she will look into adding workshops to Parent University for next year.

Immunization Letter to Parents

Ms. Gierasch gave an overview of the immunization changes for the incoming kindergarten and sixth grade classes.

Discussion:

Mrs. Bernstein asked if a letter was sent out to the local pediatricians.

Ms. Gierasch stated that they have not.

Ms. Becker said that Ms. Spector was in the process of getting the letter out to some of the local pediatricians and that they also did an e-mail blast.

Mrs. Pierno asked if it involved just the two grades.

Ms. Gierasch said that as of right now this is all that is required. She stated how much extra work this will be for our school nurses. She added, that if anyone has any questions about the new requirements, to please contact her or their school nurse.

<u>NSBA</u>

Mrs. Schulman gave an overview of the three workshops she attended. The first was on Social Media and Communication; it offered suggestions on how to communicate and get messages out in the best way. She said that Facebook and Twitter were the most popular with the 30-64 year olds and that that is the common age of the parents. The second workshop she attended regarded security. She spoke of the challenges that Plainedge High School has overcome on the school field. She spoke of the security cameras that were installed and how vandalism has decreased, because as she said, "the cameras don't lie". She said that the presenter spoke about the costs associated with updating security, and that there were many homeland security grants available. The third workshop she attended was on Special Education and it presented efficient ways to get what you need, even with the tax cap. Mrs. Schulman feels that POB is doing a great job in regard to the programs they have in place, such TAG, and is providing enough support to keep our kids in the district.

Mrs. Rothman left the room at 8:40 and returned at 8:42.

Mrs. Pierno also highlighted the workshops she attended. The first one she attended was The Best of Both Digital Learning Worlds-Cloud Computing and BYOD. One of the takeaways was that the districts don't have to make the investment in the hardware that will quickly become obsolete. Some benefits of Cloud are that it is free, and there is flexibility when and if a new solution comes out. It also analyzed ISP venders' uptime, reliability and security; there are specific uptime and security criteria in the contract. Another was Data Driven Decision Making which she did not find that informative. Rise above the Mark-Promoting Educational Reform That Works was a documentary that highlighted the problems that public education is experiencing, due to political agendas. She was able to order a free copy of the movie which she will share with the Board. The last one she attended was Developing Capacity to Transform Teaching Prior to a Mobile One-on-One initiative. She stated that it is teacher led and that it creates interdisciplinary collaboration where teachers look for ways to blend technology in the classroom. She felt that overall it was an informative conference.

PE Grading Policy Update

Mr. Braico gave an overview of the first year of the PE grading policy.

Discussion:

Ms. Gierasch asked Mr. Braico to explain the unexcused absence policy.

Mr. Braico explained that the students were given two unexcused absences per quarter, when it should have been per semester, so they were getting one extra. He would like to see the Board policy reinstated allowing three absences per semester.

Mrs. Lieberman thanked Mr. Braico for the report. She asked if the students failing P.E. know that they will have to make it up during the summer.

Mr. Braico stated that they did. He said that they are not setting the program up for failure but to foster success for everybody.

Mr. Murray added that this is the first time that he has not had a conversation with a student not graduating on time due to gym failure.

Ms. Gierasch stated that there are now more opportunities for make-ups, and that they must be made up within a two- week time frame.

Mr. Braico stated that the students figured out pretty quickly that the number grade was not going on their transcripts, so no one was failing the first quarter. The grades dropped from that point on. He said that we will wait and see what the fourth quarter brings.

Mrs. Bernstein asked what happened to the students who failed the first quarter in past years.

Mr. Murray stated that if they failed the first quarter they had to double up the second semester.

Mrs. Rothman asked what the surrounding schools did in regard to putting the number grade on the transcript.

Mr. Braico said that it was varied.

Mrs. Pierno asked about excused absences and if the students will be taking surveys again this year. She also asked what the parent response was.

Mr. Braico stated that the parent response has been positive and that the students will be taking a survey again this year; however, since he had tallied up the scans last year, they may use survey monkey this year. He also said that the students get four excused absences and one makeup and that has worked out well.
