There were approximately 65 district residents and staff members present.

Mrs. Weinstein called the meeting to order at 7:50 p.m. and welcomed everyone to this evening's Board of Education meeting.

The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

High School Report

, our high school representative, updated the Board of Education on events at the high school.

Announcements

Mrs. Rothman stated that she had the pleasure of being a referee at the Harlem Wizards/Plainview-Old Bethpage Middle School basketball game. She noted that it was very well attended. Mrs. Rothman stated Ms. Gierasch played so well that the Harlem Wizards offered her a contract. She stated that Mr. Cepeda, Mr. Ruf and Mr. Gergis also played.

Mr. Cepeda thanked PTA for sponsoring such a worthwhile event. Everyone had a wonderful time.

Mr. Dempsey stated that we are attempting to improve our website to make access to the site easier.

Mr. Jonas stated that we are also trying to make it easier to communicate with our community. You will be able to reach the site by going to www.pobschools.org or just pobschools.org.

Mr. Dempsey stated that we received an announcement from County Executive Suozzi's office about an upcoming parental educational series. We held two of these types of seminars previously in Plainview. The first series will take place at the Lecture Hall in the Police Academy in Massapequa Park. They are as follows:

Thursday, November 19 at 7:00 p.m. - Gang Awareness

Thursday, December 3 at 7:00 p.m. – Internet Child Exploitation, Sexting and Child Safety on the Internet.

Thursday, December 10 at 7:00 p.m. – Heroin and Drug Awareness

Mr. Dempsey urged everyone to attend.

Mrs. Lieberman stated that they are excellent topics. She stated that parents have an obligation to speak to their children about these things. They have tremendous ramifications in their lives. She urged parents to talk to their children.

Reports

Superintendent's Conference Day

Ms. Gierasch stated that this was a very successful event due to the collaborative planning of our district administration. Each session was tailored to the needs of a particular department or level of instruction. Some of our administrators were presenters. Best practices were shared. At the Kindergarten Center there were workshops focused on literacy and behavior. There were workshops in grades 1 and 2 for literacy, math and science. In grades 3 and 4 there were science and social studies workshops. Some principals were presenters.

At the middle school level Ms. Dianne Drew from the Dwight School had an IB workshop. There was a workshop on Great Books for teachers of ELA, Science and Social Studies. Tom Schwartz, Angela DeLessio and Joan Wartell worked with Fred Cohen to prepare for the session on Data Warehouse.

Ms. Gierasch stated at the high school level department goals were addressed in many different areas including data warehousing, writing, smart boards and adaptive physical education goals. Outside conferences were held for art and music. Our aides received strategies for difficult behavioral situations and the custodians were involved in an asbestos awareness workshop.

Ms. Gierasch stated that we tried to tailor the day so everyone could work on their particular goals. She thanked the staff and administrators for their support in making the day so successful.

Discussion:

Mrs. Pierno asked if we conduct a survey to see what worked and what was successful.

Ms. Gierasch stated we had a survey for feedback and shared e-mails.

Mr. Bettan asked if during the data workshop, we discovered anything that needed to be addressed.

Ms. Gierasch stated there was no "ah ha" moment except that it really isn't so difficult to navigate. The teacher interface was the most informative.

Mrs. Weinstein asked if we follow up at the building level.

Ms. Gierasch stated that we do. As a matter of fact, in some cases, the Superintendent's Conference Day was a follow up day to other staff development sessions. She has attended some follow up conferences in a few elementary schools.

Mrs. Weinstein asked if we did this for literacy.

Ms. Gierasch stated the teachers did have follow up.

Mrs. Lieberman noted there was training at the high school for smart boards. Did we have any training at the elementary and middle school levels.

Ms. Gierasch stated we didn't have teachers available to share on that day. The teachers do have opportunities to utilize smart boards and attend staff development sessions throughout the year as part of their 18 hour requirement.

Mr. Cepeda asked if the material was available electronically.

Ms. Gierasch stated we did forward material to the elementary principals electronically.

Mrs. Rothman stated we had a workshop on asbestos. Will we have one on mold.

Mr. Ruf will look into it.

<u>Literacy Intervention Programs</u>

Ms. Gierasch discussed our literacy programs. She spoke of Read 180. Six out of seven schools had this program last year in grades 4-12. This year it will be used in all seven schools. She spoke of our licenses. She stated that we need additional material. We need to train teachers to analyze reports. Students probably stay in the program for 2 years at the most but this is not set in stone. Ms. Gierasch stated that we need to look at how we are utilizing staff. The feed back we are receiving is that the students and staff love it.

Ms. Gierasch discussed System 44. Six out of seven schools utilized this program last year. All schools are using it this year.

Ms. Gierasch discussed Leveled Literacy Intervention which is for groups of three to five and reading intervention is given daily for 30 minutes. Our first grade XR teachers are trained to use this. One reading teacher from each elementary school utilizes this program as well.

Ms. Gierasch stated that Reading Recovery is no longer formally being used. Our staff is well versed in this methodology. We eliminated Headsprouts because it is redundant to Fundations

She stated that Fundations has been piloted in five classrooms in the Kindergarten Center. We plan to use it in all kindergarten classes next year. First grade teachers will utilize this program in all classrooms beginning in January.

Ms. Gierasch discussed benchmarking and the need to determine a student's reading level at least three times a year.

Ms. Gierasch thanked everyone for their work.

Discussion:

Mrs. Lieberman discussed feedback from the staff. She wants the Board to be kept up to date. She would like the Board of Education to receive reports regarding staff feedback.

Mr. Bettan asked which school was not involved in Read 180 and System 44 last year. Is that school participating this year.

Ms. Gierasch stated that it was Parkway School and they are participating this year.

Mrs. Bernstein asked if we are developing a plan to meet the needs that were noted this evening.

Ms. Gierasch stated that the teachers made good suggestions. We do have a plan to have teachers come in and tell what is working. We should share best practices.

Mrs. Weinstein asked if these programs will be done only by reading teachers.

Ms. Gierasch stated that they will also be implemented by special education teachers. They don't need reading certification to deliver these services.

Mrs. Rothman thanked Ms. Gierasch for a terrific report. Reading Recovery is a well known successful program. When this program was instituted, we wanted immediate improvement. She asked if we will follow the progress of the children in these programs.

Ms. Gierasch stated you can track a child's progress.

Mrs. Rothman stated we did not see tracking reports. She would like to see this in the future.

Mr. Cepeda asked since we have information available, can we share this information with the parents.

Ms. Gierasch stated we have AIS report cards. Our teachers stay in contact with parents.

Mrs. Lieberman stated that she has always been a proponent of Reading Recovery which was one to one. The new program now has one to five children in a group. Will we be able to help the child that is still struggling.

Ms. Gierasch stated we can do one to one intervention.

Mrs. Lieberman stated that she does not want any child to get lost in the shuffle.

Mrs. Weinstein thanked Ms. Gierasch for her outstanding comprehensive report. She asked at some point can we talk about our philosophy for the children who are at level or above level. How do they move forward.

Ms. Gierasch discussed balanced literacy and the need to look at how this is being delivered district wide.

Regional Summer School Expenses

Mr. Jonas discussed the finances of the summer school program. He spoke of the cost for summer school including Nassau BOCES administration fees. Mr. Jonas stated that the district's expenditures for security, teacher aides, custodial and supplies were \$14,398.43. Our share of the total cost of summer school is \$45,600. This expenditure will be compensated by BOCES aid which we will receive in the next school year. Our total expense will be \$32,000.

Discussion

Mrs. Bernstein thanked everyone for a very successful summer school program. We had initially been uneasy about the program. However, it worked out wonderfully. Our academics were maintained and we saved money. She congratulated everyone involved in the program.

Mr. Jonas informed the Board that because of construction going on at Bethpage High School, the Bethpage School District has requested that we house the summer school program for the 2010 school year.

The Board agreed.

Public Participation

Ms. Lisa Mintz, chairperson of the PTA elementary curriculum committee last year, spoke of the inconsistencies between the four elementary schools. She expressed her views that the core curriculum should be the same at all schools. She stated that Stratford Road is not receiving the same books as the other three schools. She discussed other differences between the schools.

Mr. Dempsey stated we are trying to mirror prior years. We try to make sure the child's experience is the same as in past years. The goal is to have the experience of the children this year the same as it was for children in prior years. We are looking at test materials. Each of our schools uses different books. We are looking at this and what is best for the children.

Ms. Mintz stated that the Parkway and Old Bethpage children are growing at a faster pace.

Mr. Dempsey discussed the performance of the Stratford Road and Pasadena children and testing. He spoke of strategies that can be taught. If there is a common workbook that will work, we will look at this.

Ms. Mintz stated that this is something that should be looked at across the entire district.

Mr. Dempsey stated we want every student at mastery.

Ms. Meredith Radisch thanked the Board for providing the information on reading programs in the District this evening. She stated that her son participated in Reading Recovery and it was a wonderful program. She spoke of the new reading program that we are instituting.

Ms. Radisch discussed the proposed possible cuts to state aid. She stated that financial issues have hit all of us. She supports the Board for sticking to their guns regarding pay raises. She spoke about discrepancies between what the community was told the increase in taxes would be and what they actually were. She asked for an explanation. She stated we should get rid of waste. It is important that we improve our financial picture. She also stated that we should offer extra help at the elementary level.

Ms. Radisch stated she does not want to take away from teachers. Her children are very happy. They have wonderful teachers. She expressed her views that the union leaders may think they are doing what is best for their teachers. She doesn't believe they are.

Mr. Dempsey asked Mr. Ruf to discuss the tax levy and the reasons for the discrepancy.

Mr. Ruf addressed this subject. He reviewed the numbers that were spelled out in NEWSDAY. He told of the questions he was asked for a NEWSDAY survey published on May 1st. He outlined the reasons for the discrepancies.

Mr. Dempsey congratulated Mr. Ruf for the answer he provided. He made a difficult explanation easy to understand.

Mr. Weinstein also thanked Mr. Ruf for his response.

Ms. Emily Schulman, Co-President of SEPTA, asked about the different reading programs. She asked how we know that Reading 180 is helping. What are we using to measure success.

Ms. Gierasch responded.

Ms. Schulman asked about staffing for special education kids in the summer school program.

Mr. Jonas stated we added another special education teacher and aide last year. Our kids did well but they can always do better.

Mr. Jacques Wolfner asked what will happen if the Governor cuts state aid mid year. Will we balance our budget.

Mr. Dempsey stated we have several options. He explained our options. He stated it is our hope that even if there is a mid year reduction, it would be less than stated.

Mr. Wolfner asked for an explanation of item 3f under Finance.

Ms. Mia Schwartz stated she supports the teachers. She compared Plainview to Syosset and Jericho. She stated that a 9 period day would benefit students. She expressed her view that there is very poor communication with the teachers in Plainview. She is a teacher in the Commack School District. She spoke of the requirements regarding communicating with parents and returning phone calls and e-mails in the Commack District.

Ms. Melissa Kessler discussed Fundations. She is a teacher in a surrounding district that uses Fundations. She believes teachers should be paid an adequate salary. She spoke of the things she buys for her class with her own money.

Ms. Gierasch stated that all Kindergarten teachers have teacher kits. It is our intention to move it forward.

Ms. Kessler asked why first grade students are not graded academically in the first quarter.

Mr. Dempsey stated we are looking at this.

Ms. Stefanie Nelkens stated it was great that she received her son's report card prior to the parent-teacher conference. She asked if any thought has been given to providing an academic grade prior to the 2nd quarter. Report cards could provide a benchmark to all parents.

Mr. Dempsey stated we don't have a time line to resolve the report card issue. The benchmark would be an issue that we want to look at.

Ms. Nelkens asked how we are communicating this information to the parents. She wants to know her child's reading level every time he is tested. She is sure other parents feel the same way.

Mr. Dempsey stated when we have a recommendation it will be made to the Board.

- Ms. Nelkens asked how parents get benchmark levels.
- Mrs. Weinstein stated that you can ask the teacher.
- Ms. Nelkens asked if parents are aware of the reading programs that are being used in our schools. She asked if parents can ask the teacher their child's reading level.
- Mr. Dempsey stated we are working on a process to make it available districtwide.
- Ms. Nelkens stated that she asked these questions a year ago.
- Mr. David Radisch discussed the long term financial drain in our school district due to the pensions we provide to the teachers. He expressed his views that we now have a good opportunity to stop the pension fund. The Board should consider this.
- M. Dempsey stated that the teacher retirement system is a statewide issue. The State tries to deal with this through the "tier" system.
- Mr. Guercio stated that the issue of school districts' contribution to pensions is an issue that is not addressed locally. It is a state issue. This is outside the control of the district.







Ms. Debbie Bernstein stated that last week she and other Board Members had the honor to attend the DECA Installation at the high school. Mrs. Bernstein noted that we installed over 200 students. The PCT and the Board are relatively far apart in year two. We are unable to close the gap. The negotiators talk frequently but up until now we have not been able to close the gap. He noted that they spoke this evening.

Mr. Guercio stated that as developments continue, we will do our best to keep the community apprised.

Mr. Dempsey stated that educational and instructional practices continue as in previous years. The principals and teachers have continued to focus on student work being displayed in the classrooms and hallways of all the schools. Parent participation, classroom visitations, curriculum programs and other school and classroom programs have begun in each school.

Mr. Dempsey stated that he anticipates that these activities and displays will continue this year as they have in past years. He has been told that instruction is being maintained as it has in past years.

Reports

NYSSBA Convention – October 15-18, 2009 – New York City

Mrs. Weinstein discussed the New York State School Board's Association Annual Convention which was held in New York City, October 15 -18, 2009. Board Members will report on seminars and sessions they attended.

Mrs. Rothman stated that she attended a seminar at the law conference that dealt with student suicides. She noted that suicide is the third leading cause of death for young people between the ages of 10 and 24. The speakers discussed who is at risk; are there warning signs, legal issues and what districts can do before and after. She spoke of policies that Boards should adopt before a problem arises. These policies should cover student discipline codes. They should also provide appropriate efforts to provide intervention from peer violence and bullying and sexting. The seminar also provided some ideas for programs, such as Lifelines. Mrs. Rothman stated that we need to address this critical issue as a community, not just a school district.

Mrs. Weinstein spoke of the seminar she attended on the Columbine Tragedy. She noted that it has been 10 years since the events at Columbine occurred. Members of the panel spoke about board initiatives, community efforts, support systems and safety measures that are helping the school community. Mrs. Weinstein stated that she was struck by the question that was asked, "If everything was in place, would anything have been different." They answered, "Probably not."

Mrs. Lieberman spoke of the meeting she attended where the New Chancellor, Meryl Tisch and the new Commissioner of Education, David Steiner, spoke. The Commissioner said there is going to be an open door policy. He discussed art and technology. Commissioner Steiner stated that with regard to the swine flu, one size does not fit all. He spoke about testing.

Mrs. Lieberman expressed her views that we should be very happy with the changes in Albany.

Mr. Bettan spoke of the technology session he attended. He noted we are not in the forefront of technology but we are not behind. He spoke of the smart board seminar that he attended that dealt with writing and then the editing of this writing. He spoke of a vocabulary testing program. Mr. Bettan noted that technology can be used as a tool for teachers.

Mr. Bettan went to a seminar on Infinite Campus. He spoke of project based learning. He was excited because of what we are doing in the 7th grade with regard to interdisciplinary projects.

Mr. Cepeda discussed the business meeting he attended. It was attended by over 250 delegates because of all the issues surrounding education. Fiscal issues were discussed at length. They encouraged board members that this too will pass. Things will get better. NYSSBA will continue to support public education.

Mr. Cepeda read the ten resolutions that were approved.

Mrs. Bernstein spoke of the session she attended on small learning communities given by the Poughkeepsie City School District. The participants were the Superintendent, the Assistant Superintendent of Curriculum, the middle school principal, the Board President, and two teacher coaches. One was the President of the Teacher's Union. They discussed their small learning community with regard to learning units within a larger school setting, school within a school concept-academies, teams of students, teams of teachers, common meeting times for teachers, Administrator/Counselor Support, professional development and appropriate staffing, materials, supplies and equipment.

Mrs. Bernstein noted that there were differences between their community and ours. She outlined the many similarities between their small learning community and IB, the program we are currently looking into. She said they looked at test scores. They spoke of analyzing the data and how they use this data. They also stated that you can never lose sight that the data represents a child. Mrs. Bernstein stated it was an inspiring and impressive seminar.

Public Participation

Mr. Mike Deginge expressed his views that we must be prepared for a lengthy dispute. He feels this may go on until December 2010. He supports the Board. He relies on the excellence of the teachers and he hopes that they will speak to their colleagues. He stated that the Union needs to get a new plan. The Board has worked hard to minimize the affect on our children. He asked what the Board wants parents to do.

Mr. Dempsey stated that parents should maintain as much normal behavior as possible.

Meredith Radisch thanked the Board for giving informative information this evening. She stated that information to the community is a must. She stated that we are saddened that our children have been dragged into adult negotiations. She expressed her concerns that the changes that have occurred will continued. She hopes the atmosphere in the school improves.

Ms. Radisch asked about give backs. She spoke about extra help for children. If she, as a taxpayer, has to pay more, she wants more.

Mr. Guercio stated that negotiations on Long Island take various forms. In some school districts, the Board of Education put additional money on the table and a longer contract in exchange for givebacks. Other school districts, and Plainview-Old Bethpage is one, feel there will be a very serious impact because of the State's budget. There will be no more Federal stimulus money. The State of New York is in dire financial straits. Plainview-Old Bethpage is more conservative in its approach. Something has to give.

Mr. John Gershy comes from three generations of union workers. He spoke of unemployment and the under employment rate. People are losing their homes. He sees nothing wrong with a freeze on salaries. He spoke of what other school districts offer their students. He spoke about the "Contract Now" buttons.

Mr. Guercio stated there is case law with regard to buttons and tee shirts. Those are free speech rights.

Ms. Nina Trembly stated that her children who attend Mattlin and Old Bethpage Elementary Schools have not been impacted by the negotiations. They are having an excellent year.

A resident whose children go to Mattlin Middle School has seen no impact because of negotiations. She appreciates what the teachers do every single day.

Ms. Kathy Rea, President of POB Middle School PTA thanked the Board and the administrators for their participation in their fund raiser when the Harlem Wizards will be facing the POBMS Middle Magic on November 4th.

A resident spoke of the elimination of aides several years ago. She expressed her views that we should compromise. We need to hire the best teachers and they cost money. She suggested that the teachers receive an increase and we should demand more instructional time for our kids.

Mr. David Radisch stated that in a perfect world, teachers would get more money. However, we don't have the money to give. He noted there was a 51% increase in the number of children who get free lunches. He discussed the pension debt. We are not Jericho. If teachers are so unhappy here, they should teach elsewhere.

A resident spoke of a car dealership that was closed down and how this affects the employees of this dealership. We need a reality check.

Mr. Ed Letterer expressed confidence that the Board will do the sensible thing. He stated that the information that Mr. Guercio provided was great. We have to put more fact based information out to the community. He asked when the last face to face communication between the negotiators occurred. When are they scheduled again.

Mr. Guercio stated that there is on going continuous information.

Mr. Letterer asked about the process. He asked who makes the decision on who lets the parents into the classrooms.

Mr. Dempsey stated that things that occurred last year are happening this year.

Mr. Letterer stated that the policy is not the same in all buildings. He stated that policies should be consistent and there should be parity throughout the schools.

Mr. Letterer expressed his views that the singers that sang the National Anthem this evening were wonderful.

Mr. Norman Coyle asked if teachers are graded. He suggested that good teachers should get raises. He compared the costs of private schools to the costs of our school district. He noted that ours cost much more.

Mr. Dempsey stated that public schools have many more responsibilities that add to the cost. The cost to educate a child in our district are in the mid range.

Ms. Stefanie Nelkens discussed the money for the books in the current budget. She stated that she has requested and has not received a side by side comparison for materials used in the different schools. She wants to see the ELA materials. Ms. Nelkens discussed copyright infringements. She asked if there was a resolution of the materials she brought to administration to show what was copied.

Mr. Dempsey responded that materials that can be copied will be copied.

Ms. Nelkens stated that she has heard that an entire English book was copied for every student in a particular class at the high school.

Ms. Nelkens requested that her son receive a copy of the ELA book he would have received if he were a student at Parkway, Pasadena or Old Bethpage Elementary Schools.

A resident stated that she received an informational letter from the Union. She asked how the Union had her name and address to send her this letter.

Mr. Ken Sintelli urged the Board to keep fighting for the community.

A resident expressed her concern about the lack of work being displayed. She was told that teachers were being told not to work up to their full potential. She spoke of the environment that is being created by the teachers this year. She stated that teachers are professional and deserve compensation. She spoke of the Union's goal. She spoke of people losing their jobs and taking salary cuts.

Ms. Terry Ratner discussed test scores. Her children have received positive experiences. Parents have always worked with teachers to see that their children do well. She noted that she has spent hundreds of dollars on tutors.
