

## MRS. AHLSEN'S BEHAVIOR POLICY

Every student is entitled to a classroom environment that is safe and allows them to learn. Following the rules creates and maintains an environment in which each individual is respected, and should be able to maximize his or her potential. The building and district rules will be enforced in class in addition to the rules that follow. Please review this sheet with your parents or guardians. You all will sign and return the tear off to me. The rest of this sheet is to be kept in your binder.

### CLASSROOM RULES

1. Be in your seat and ready to work (with all of your materials) when the bell rings.
2. Follow directions the first time they are given.
3. Eating, drinking and gum chewing will NOT be allowed in science class. Cell phones, devices capable of recording and or playing audio and video are NOT permitted and will be confiscated. Please do not bring hats, coats and book bags to class.
4. Respect others and their property. School property such as textbooks, lab equipment and the desks are to be treated with respect.
5. Please raise your hand and wait to be called on before speaking. **ONLY ONE** person speaks at a time.

### ENFORCEMENT: CONSEQUENCES AND REWARDS

When the rules above are followed it creates a positive learning environment for everyone. If a student breaks the rules during a single class period these are the consequences:

The first time a student breaks a rule their name will be recorded, this is a warning.

If the student continues to break the same rule or breaks another rule a check mark (✓) will be recorded next to their name. The student will be required to serve 10 minutes of detention.

The third time a rule is broken a second check mark will be added. The student will be required to serve 20 minutes in detention.

If the student breaks the rules for the fourth time in the **SAME** class period (three checkmarks) they will be required to serve a FULL period of detention and there will be a phone call to the home.

Four checkmarks will require me write a referral to the assistant principal in addition to the detention and a phone call home.

**REWARDS:**

When the behavior of the CLASS is acceptable (as determined by the teacher and or a substitute) the class will be credited with some sort of “counter”. When each class reaches the predetermined goal they will earn a reward. There may also be immediate rewards given to individual or a class for extra special behavior or improvements in behavior.

**TEXTBOOK POLICY**

It is currently the policy of POBMS to issue each student ONE textbook. Textbooks are the property of the school district and the book issued to the student in September must be returned in June. A book, which has been lost, stolen or so damaged that it cannot be reissued to another student, must be paid for. The full replacement cost of the textbook
