In Volleyball, he twice earned All-County honors and was named to the Newsday All-Long Island 1st team two times. Nick helped lead the Hawks' Volleyball team to two Conference and two County Championships. he was named the team MVP in Basketball and earned All-Conference honors twice. He finished his basketball career with 418 points. Next year he will continue his volleyball and academic career at Sacred Heart University.

She won Underclassmen Excellence Awards in Biology, English, AP World History, Career and Finance, and Public Speaking. She was ranked 18th in her class and graduated with a 99.43 GPA. Harrison Kyriacou was a three sport athlete, earning 11 varsity letters. He was awarded the Golden and Platinum Hawks Awards. He was a team captain in all 3 sports. 

Thomas Ensmenger—(Class of 2015) Drew University—Lacrosse—Played in 16 games and scored 3 goal and had 9 assists. In his career he had 15 goals and 18 assists. Jessica Steinhilber-(Class of 2015) - Utica College—Lacrosse—Played and started in all 17 games this season for the Pioneers. She was a Utica College President list honoree. In her career she had 2 goals and had 34 ground ball recoveries.

David Glass—(Class of 2015) - John Hopkins College—Baseball– named to the Centennial Conference Academic Honor Roll. Made 8 appearances, pitched 7 innings and striking out 5. In his career David pitched in 15 appearances, pitched 20 innings and striking out 16.



Jordan Berson—(Class of 2018) -SUNY Oneota-Lacrosse—Saw action 5 games, made 8 saves with a .615save percentage




Harrison Kyriacou has committed to Worchester Polytechnic Institute. Harrison will continue his academic and athletic career as member of the Engineers football team.

As the champions of Conference 6, POB secured a spot in the team playoffs. In the first round of the playoffs, POB lost to Conference 1 team, Great Neck North. This defeat marked the end of a remarkable season, however the style of play that was executed throughout the entire season and particularly at that playoff match set the bar high for the expectations of this program.

Seven players were awarded All-Conference honors for their exceptional regular season play. Singles players Allison Scher and Joel Yu, as well as doubles players Cleo Dallaris & Michelle Zhu, Emma Lesser & Alexa Gutterson and Sophie Goodman & Mahika Gupta.
