Lund and Faello named Student Athletes of the Year



This newsletter marks the end of another successful year of Hawks Interscholastic Athletics. The 2017-2018 year saw the Hawks reach great heights both on and off the field. Three student athletes were named to All American teams. The Boys' Golf, Baseball, and Gymnastic teams each won Conference Championships, while the Boys' Bowling and Gymnastic teams won County championships. For the second year in a row we received the School of Excellence award for outstanding academic achievement by NYSPHSAA. At the Senior Awards and Wall of Fame dinner, sponsored by POB

Athletic Booster Club, multiple awards and scholarships were handed out. Miranda Lund (Gymnastics) was named the Senior Female Student Athlete of the Year, while Mark Faello (Baseball) was named the Senior Male Student Athlete of the Year. Bryan Hirsch (Bowling)

and Jungin Lee (Swimming, Indoor track and Outdoor Track) were named Scholar Athletes of the year.



Miranda Lund was a 6 year varsity gymnast. During her career Miranda won two NYSPHSAA State Championships on beam (2016 and 2018) and the all-around NYSPHSAA title in 2016. She has also been crowned the Nassau County Individual Gymnastics Champion twice. She was a three time All-American and two All-State. She has lead her team to 3 Nassau County Championships and 3 Conference Championships. Next year Miranda will continue her gymnastics and academic career at Cornell University.

Mark Faello was a 4 year varsity baseball player. During his career he had a record of 15-1 with a 1.73 ERA and 212 strikeouts. He also batted .322 with 5 HR and 38 RBIs. In 2017 he was named the Diamond Award winner. This is given to the top pitcher in Nassau County. He was All-State in 2017 and All- County in 2016, 2018. He helped lead the Hawks to back to back Conference Championships. Next year Mark will continue his baseball and academic career at Hofstra University.

Boys' Golf Conference Champions!



The 2018 Boys' Golf team had one of the most successful seasons in program history, as they captured the Conference Championship for the first time since 2011 with a 7-1 record. The Hawks were led by junior co-captain and All-County recipient Saurav Bhasin who registered the team's low score for the County Tournament along with senior co-captain and All-County Honorable Mention recipient Minchul Kim.

Also receiving post season awards for the Hawks were All Conference recipients senior Ethan Birnbaum and freshman Sachin Bhasin.

One highlight for the Hawks this year came on May 3rd at Bethpage's green course where the Hawks overtook perennial champs Port Washington with a great 8-1 team victory to clinch the Conference Championship. The Hawks showed their ability to perform under pressure as 5 of the 6 matches were decided by less than 3 strokes.

The final highlight of the 2018 season came on the last day of the Nassau County Championship Tournament where Saurav Bhasin shot a 76 on Bethpage's red course to finish in the top 8 out of the 130 participants to qualify for the NY State Championships at Cornell University. Saurvay became Plainview-Old Bethpage JFK's first state representative in over a decade.

Boys' Tennis Serves Up Another Banner Year

The 2018 spring season was another solid one for the Boys' Varsity Tennis team. For the 3rd straight year the net men stormed their way into the Nassau County Team playoffs semifinals. They posted their best regular season record in 9 seasons, finishing in 3rd place in the toughest conference in Nassau County, Conference I.

The top of our card was well-manned by Sophomore Jared Phillips, who posted an outstanding 12-4 record, playing against some of the best singles players in Nassau, in his 3rd year as a singles starter. This earned him All-Conference honors. (Just a side note: Jared has filled the spot vacated by NYS 2-time reigning Singles Champion, Yuval Solomon, who graduated last June and is a member of the newly crowned 2018 NCAA Collegiate Tennis Champions, Wake Forrest.) The strength of our team has truly been our singles players, rounded out by Sophomore Anthony Casale and Junior Ethan Treihaft. Both are honored as All-Division players.

Keeping with that youth theme, of the team's perennial 11 starters, 8 of them are currently sophomores or younger. This bodes well for our team for seasons to come. Anchoring the Hawks were seniors, Nick Dechiaro and Alex Wright, who contributed mightily in the doubles ranks. Both of these players received All-Division honors, as did their doubles partners, Sean Cohen and Sam Weissman, respectively. Also achieving this honor was Brandon Bernstein and Ido Moriah.

The Hawks' entries into the "Counties," Nassau's county-wide tournament for the best singles and doubles of the more than 60 tennis teams of our high schools, were a great success, as well. Anthony Casale fought through the singles brackets to attain All-County status, while Dechiaro and Cohen advance all the way to the Final 4 of doubles teams to be crowned as All-State players!

Hawks Boys Tennis has a very bright future! Not only do we return nearly everyone from our starting roster next season, but they possess several years of varsity competition experience. To add to all that, our Junior Varsity team moved up to Conference 1 competition for the first time, battling the best the county has to offer at the JV level. This has primed them well to compete with the best at the Varsity level. Great season Hawks!!

Baseball—Back to Back Conference Champions

The 2018 Hawks varsity baseball team enjoyed another amazing and fun filled season with some great games and lots of memories. This spring, the team finished 18-6 overall, including the playoffs. In league play, the Hawks went 14-4 and won the regular season conference championship again. This is the first time since 2003-2004 that the Hawks won back to back regular season conference titles. The team won all six series they played, getting a sweep in two of them. This helped the Hawks earn the number 2 seed in the AA playoffs, home field advantage, and a first round bye.

The playoffs started against the Port Washington Vikings in what turned out to be a crazy, week-long series because of weather and TWO suspended games. The Hawks took the series two games to one. The first game had to be continued because of rain. It resumed two days later. The third and final game was suspended after 12 innings of play because of darkness with the game tied 2-2. The game was finished the following afternoon, with the Hawks coming out on top 3-2.

The victory propelled the Hawks into the semi-finals against 4th seed, and defending LI champions, the Massapequa Chiefs, who had beaten the Hawks in the county finals last year. This series ended the way last years finals did, with the Chiefs upending the Hawks. It ended the season and a great two year run that saw the Hawks go 30-6 in league play and 37-13 overall the last two springs. Many good things came out of the season, along with many accomplishments for individual players and the team.

The POB Girls' outdoor track teams had one of its best seasons ever. The team won 17 medals, 8 of them at Divisional Championships and 2 at County Championships. The leadership of this team was generated from the captains; Jenna Chow, Sinead Heaney, Isabel Wallach, & Jane Wernow. Head Coach Justin Carey and Assistant Coach Brianne Yannotta couldn't have been more proud of the teams individual and group efforts. The team MVP, junior Amy Lederer, is an incredible athlete who broke the school record in 400IH 3 times during the season. She also broke the school record

in the SMR relay with Leah Chavez, Isabel Wallach, and Emily Yagudaev. She broke the school record in the 4 x 800m relay with Leah Chavez, Sinead Heaney, and Jane Wernow. Amy earned 2 All Division awards in the 400IH and 100HH. Other record breaking feats were accomplished by senior Angelina Kim in Pole Vault who jumped 9 feet three times during the season and earned both All Division as well as All County awards. Freshman Shaina Smith broke the school record in high jump twice during the season with her best jump at 5'2", earning her All County and 2nd place at the State Qualifier.
