Our high school students also used sign language to pose questions relevant to the necessary college preparation for being an interpreter of the deaf or for using American Sign Language in other fields of social service.



During lunch members of the American Sign Language Honor Society enjoyed pizza and soda with their new friends, communicating further on a variety of more informal topics relevant to teenage life. An invitation was extended to our students to attend the prom for Mill Neck School.
