The *Luminaria Ceremony* took place after dark. This event is meant to provide a memorable way to honor loved ones lost to cancer as well as those who have fought cancer in the past, and support those whose fight continues. Candles were lit inside of personalized bags and were placed around the Relay track as glowing tributes to those who've been affected by cancer.
