**Quarter 3 Student Parking Applications** are available in the Main Office and on JFKHS's web page. Applications must be submitted no later than the end of period 10 on Friday, January 18. Student and parent/guardian must have attended the Safe Teen Driving Program. Please see application for details of documentation to be submitted and Student Parking and Driving Regulations.

Reminder to all students that **ID Cards must be displayed at all times during the school day.** Beginning Quarter 3, Wednesday, January 30, 2019, POBJFK administration will be meeting with those students who continue not to display their ID cards. Your grade level Assistant Principal will follow up with a phone call home if we've had to address this concern. If you have misplaced your ID card, or there is an issue with your ID picture, please stop by the Main Office for assistance. Thank you for your cooperation in your efforts to make all of our students and staff feel safer in their school.

Students who registered for the **Driver Education Spring session**, the schedule is now available in the Main Office. Please come down to the Main Office and pick up a copy of your Driver Education instruction dates.

New **Scholar Chip ID cards**, along with grade-level colored lanyards, have been provided to students. Scholar Chip ID Cards are accessible in the library to take out books and in the cafeteria for students' Nutrikids accounts. If for any reason, a student did not receive one, please stop by the Main Office and one will be provided. It is our expectation that **students will wear or display their ID cards at all times** during the school day. As part of our new safety initiatives, students without off-campus privileges will not be permitted to leave the building during the school day due to safety concerns. Students with off-campus privileges will be required to "tap out" and "tap in" at the new card reader stations located at the main office entrance. Thank you for your efforts in keeping our schools safe and secure.

Attention all 9<sup>th</sup> and 12<sup>th</sup> graders, if you have not yet picked up your **Chromebooks**, please do so during your free period or 10<sup>th</sup> period in the library.

Please be advised there is **no parking allowed on Washington Avenue and the side streets** off of Washington Ave. Nassau County Police will be ticketing any cars that are parked on these streets.

**ATTENTION STUDENTS WHO PARK IN THE PLAINVIEW POOL PARKING LOT:** Please do not move the safety cones that are placed in the parking spots. They are specifically put there for your protection, and should not be tampered with. Additionally, when parking near a cone, please leave space between your car and the cone. Please be advised that the Plainview Community Pool parking lot will be closing at 7 PM each day until further notice. Students parking at the pool must remove their cars no later than 7 PM.

PARENTS, please be advised that some students who park in the **Plainview Pool parking lot are crossing in the middle of the street**, rather than at the light at the corner. Crossing in the middle of the road, weaving between cars, is a very dangerous situation especially in the early morning when it is still dark. Please discuss with your children the dangers involved in crossing this way and instruct them to cross at the light only.

We are asking all students who are **parking on Washington Avenue** to be mindful not to park on our neighbors' grass. This is not only damaging to the grass but to the sprinkler systems of the homes. Please make sure to keep your tires on the roadway.

STUDENTS, please make sure all of your **valuables are locked up in your gym locker** during your Physical Education class. There have been thefts in the locker room for those items that are not locked up. If you cannot fit your valuables in your gym locker, please do not bring them to school or leave them locked in your regular school locker. The POB school district is not responsible for theft of personal belongings, so please make sure they are safely locked up at all times.

Attention Seniors: LI2Day Walk's Scholarship Program has awarded over \$230,000 in the past 15 years. Scholarships are available to graduating students from Nassau and Suffolk Counties. See below for details on eligibility requirements for the **LI2Day Scholarship and Maria A. Sciara Scholarship**.

**LI2Day Scholarship:** This is a \$2,500 scholarship that will be awarded to 5 graduating seniors in Nassau and Suffolk Counties. The student must be a survivor of breast cancer and/or other women's cancers, or reside with a parent or guardian who is a survivor of breast cancer and/or other women's cancers, or have resided with a parent or guardian who has passed from breast cancer and/or other women's cancers.

**Maria A. Sciara Scholarship:** This is a \$2,500 scholarship that will be awarded to 3 graduating seniors in Nassau and Suffolk Counties. The student must be a survivor of any cancer other than breast cancer and/or other women's cancers, or reside or have resided with a parent or guardian who is a survivor of any cancer other than breast cancer and/or other women's cancers, or have resided with a parent or guardian who has passed from any cancer other than breast cancer and/or other women's cancers. Those aspiring to become teachers will be given extra consideration for this scholarship but pursuing an education to become an educator IS NOT required to apply.
