

The 2022-2023 Budget Supports Expanded Opportunities for Learning and Collaboration

- Texts, titles and related supplies support new and revised courses for the 2022-2023 school year

- Additional podcast kits further develop students' interviewing skills
- New lab research equipment will allow students to conduct university level projects in house for submission to various research competitions
- Increased interest and enrollment in our EMT course calls for additional resources
- Continued partnership with Cold Spring Harbor Labs is driven by increased enrollment in AP Biology
- A newly renovated business classroom will mimic real-world business environments

The 2022-2023 Budget Supports Cultivating a Growth Mindset

- Students have access to the newest information and technologies via such tools as Vernier Probeware software, microbiology colony counters and more
- Professional memberships across contents (including a new American Association of Chemistry Teachers membership) provide professional growth, workshops, participation in honor societies, inclusion in certain language exams and access to grants, conferences, competitions, scholarships and more
