Projects for Discussion

- The 2021 Building Condition Survey identifies \$31.4M in capital work to maintain facilities and update original infrastructure.
- ➤ Administration suggests a range of projects to be funded from the 2017 Capital Reserve including:
 - > POBJFK HS Roofing
 - > Replacing original fan motor units and begin unit ventilator replacements
 - Improve ventilation systems in nurse's offices to create negative pressure environments
 - > Schedule the replacement of original restrooms
 - > Schedule the replacement of original kitchen preparation and cafeteria serving areas
