- Curriculum writing of SEL units (PPS/Guidance collaboration)/Special Class 7/8 curriculum projects



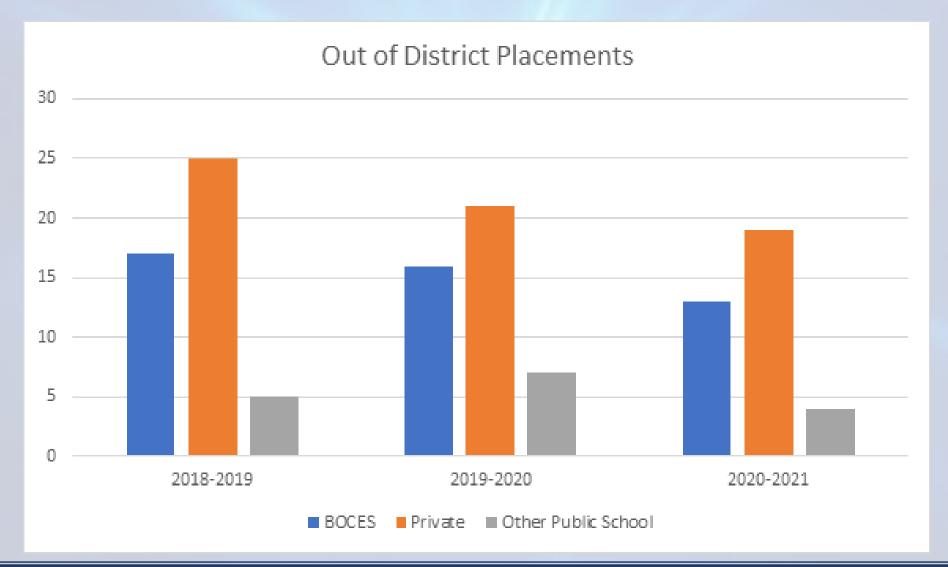
