- > 4,974 students transported to 7 In-District schools
- > 216 students transported to 24 Private & Parochial schools
- > 29 students are transported to 16 Special Education schools

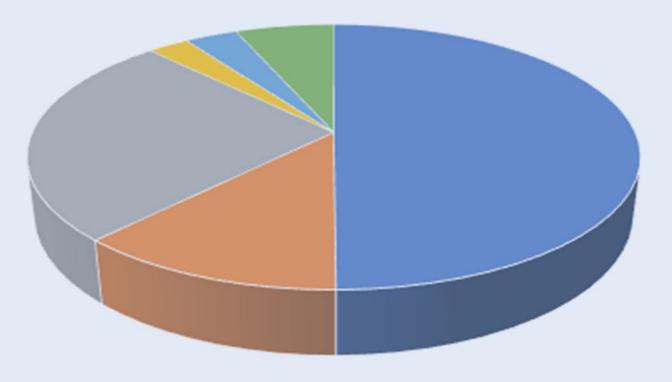
