## *5,482 Students Routed To and From 54 Schools*

- ✓ 5,240 students transported to the 7 in-District schools
- ✓ 203 students transported to 28 private & parochial schools
- ✓ 37 students transported to 19 special education placements
- ✓ Support transportation to mid-day and after-school programs such as:
  - Work Study, Project Challenge, Discovery Lab, Fun Time, Twilight Program, TAG and various athletic shuttles
- ✓ Coordinate field trip transportation for all in-District schools

- ✓ Continue to partner with transportation contractors and provide input on Driver Training Programs focusing on customer service, conflict resolution, and handling emergency situations, to ensure a positive and secure experience for students and parents.
