Ethan Hsu and Skylar Cowen Are Among 300 Students Recognized for Their Research


Ethan's project, A Novel Application of Intracellular Anandamide Manipulation in C. elegans as a Model for a New Pharmacological Treatment for Autism Spectrum Disorder, looked into the ways the presence, or lack thereof, of certain molecules in the brain might affect social interactions among people diagnosed with autism.

Skylar's project, Measuring the Effectiveness of Different Stimulus and Medium Types on Environmental Decision-Making, explored the effectiveness of certain messages and mediums in convincing others of the existence of climate change.
