Once membership begins, students must complete 10 hours of Community Service with the NHS chapter. Of these 10 NHS hours, five hours are reserved for the NHS tutoring programs. Members must participate in at least 1 Chapter service project totaling three hours and NHS approved community service for the remaining two hours. Annual dues are \$20.

Must be enrolled in a music course at the time of selection as an apprentice, as well as the previous year. Students must pass a Tri-M exam administered by Mr. Bartley and receive two teacher recommendations; one must be from a music teacher. Once membership begins, students must volunteer for a minimum of 10 hours at various Tri-M events such as participating in Musical Mornings, senior center performances, and others. Members must also attend at least 75% of Tri-M meetings to maintain membership. Annual dues are \$20.
