Welcome to Pre-AP World History! We are so glad that you have chosen to challenge yourself with our course. Your summer reading assignment is designed to introduce course themes, enhance your interest, and increase your commitment to the AP program. Learning, thinking and commitment will help you enjoy and succeed in the class.

This year students will read <u>The Good Earth</u>, by Pearl S. Buck. This novel gives the reader details of traditional Chinese life, customs and attitudes in the early twentieth century. It is a glimpse into the life of Chinese peasants and the social changes that affect their traditions.

You must complete this assignment by **Friday, September 13, 2024.** It will serve as a foundation for a key portion of your 9<sup>th</sup> grade coursework, as we will be spending a significant amount of time learning about traditional Chinese culture and history. You will also need this assignment to complete a writing piece in the fall.

- **A.** <u>Assignment:</u> As you read the novel, pay particular attention to the themes\* below:
  - Husband-wife relationships
  - Parent-child relationships
  - The relationship between a husband or wife with the in-law parents
  - Relationships between members of the extended family
  - Aesthetics and ideas about beauty
  - Social mobility and class distinctions
  - Division of labor (gender)
  - Relationships among siblings
  - Urban vs. rural attitudes
  - Relationships between women of differing status

**B.** <u>Directions:</u> Choose two (2) pairs of characters from the character list (ON BACK). YOU MAY ONLY USE EACH CHARACTER ONCE. THERE ARE 4 CHARACTERS IN TOTAL- SO THINK BEFORE YOU CHOOSE YOUR PAIRS.

## For **EACH** pair:

- Task #1: Describe each character. (4 characters total)
- <u>Task #2</u>: Explain how the relationship between the characters you have chosen reflects one of the themes from the list. Be sure to use specific examples from the story to support your analysis.


