SAMPLE

Level 1

- ☐ file name changed from *Untitled Presentation* to something related to your topic
- ☐ title slide has a title that relates to your topic, and a subtitle that includes your first and last name
- ☐ every slide contains some text
- ☐ consistent fonts across all slides
- ☐ correct spelling
- ☐ consists of at least 5 slides (including title slide) using at least 3 different layouts
- ☐ at least 2 slides include an image

SAMPLE

Level 2

- ☐ file name changed from *Untitled Presentation* to something related to your topic
- ☐ title slide has a title that relates to your topic, and a subtitle that includes your first and last name
- ☐ every slide contains some text
- ☐ consistent fonts across all slides
- ☐ correct spelling
- ☐ consists of at least 8 slides (including title slide) using at least 4 different layouts
- ☐ at least 4 slides include an image
- ☐ some type of transition is used from slide to slide

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SAMPLE

Level 3

- ☐ file name changed from *Untitled Presentation* to something related to your topic
- ☐ title slide has a title that relates to your topic, and a subtitle that includes your first and last name
- ☐ every slide contains some text
- ☐ consistent fonts across all slides
- ☐ correct spelling
- ☐ consists of at least 10 slides (including title slide) using at least 5 different layouts
- ☐ at least 6 slides include an image
- ☐ some type of transition is used from slide to slide
- ☐ at least one item on each slide has its own entrance animation (fade in, fly in, zoom)
